

DECEMBER 2013 WRITTEN REPORT OF SUPERVISOR'S ACTIVITIES EAST PARKS – CRAIG KLINKE, SUPERVISOR

The weather in November was very favorable to allow us to continue to work on projects that we couldn't normally do this late into the season. Some projects we were able to work on include: pruning projects, aerating and overseeding athletic fields and parks, mulching and blowing leaves, picking trash (there is still a lot because the weather has been so warm), working on signature sign beds, and using a forestry mower for a project behind Lincoln School and an area at Yahara Golf Course.

We have also been getting ready for winter. The hockey boards are up at Olbrich. The stakes for the hockey rink at Tenney are in. The shelter at Tenney will soon have the matting down and tables and benches will be installed for the skaters. Warner Shelter will be ready for skating the first week of December. Facility Maintenance Staff will soon turn on the water on at Olbrich and Tenney as well so that the floating rinks will begin to fill and cool.

We have been converting equipment over for winter use. We have updated our plowing routes and maps and are preparing for increased responsibility to take over clearing snow at 30 additional bus stops. We have been staking parking lots and bike paths so we know where obstacles lie when everything is snow covered.

We look forward to December and the colder temperatures to come. We are excited to begin ice rink operations. We are prepared to meet the challenges of snow. We look forward to another great season of cooperation between city staff and volunteers for the Adopt an Ice Rink program.

WEST PARKS – LISA LASCHINGER, SUPERVISOR

Winter is fast approaching, and it feels like it! Crews spent a good portion of the month mulching leaves in the parks. In addition, they started cutting back perennials at the Goodman Pool. Most of our equipment was switched over for winter operations. Crews pruned and staked along snow removal routes, and we had our first try at plowing during the last week of November with a little over an inch of snow. Hockey boards were installed at Westmorland and Rennebohm, and the stakes for the hockey rinks have been put in at Vilas and Elver. In addition, the water has been turned on and the floating rinks have begun establishing. The warming shelters at Elver, Rennebohm, Goodman and Westmorland were set up for the season as well.

In early December, we are finishing up what pruning, perennial maintenance and leaf mulching we can before the ice and snow season are in full swing. We are in the process of meeting with our Adopt Ice partners and preparing them for the season. We are also lining up seasonal staff to assist with the weekend ice maintenance operations after the holidays. Following the Jingle Bell Run, the Vilas shelter will be prepared for the winter season.

Looking ahead, our ice maintenance operations will be in full swing, and the boards should be installed at Vilas and Elver before the end of the month. Crews will continue to complete snow removal operations as required. We will also be assisting other departments as necessary. If time allows, we will continue with dormant pruning, repairing tables and painting barrels.

CONSERVATION – RUSS HEFTY

Staff continued trimming brush along ski trail routes to prepare for the winter season, and installed trail signage. We laid out a new trail system for cross country skiing at Yahara Golf Course with a couple of loops. Addition trails will be added in the future. We also laid out a trail loop at Yahara for snow shoeing separated from the ski trails.

Our land management activities for the month included porcelain berry control at Owen, cutting sumac in the prairie remnant at Prairie Ridge, and buckthorn control in oak savanna restoration units at South and North Cherokee Marsh. We rented a forestry mower from the DNR to clear exotic shrubs along the trails at South Cherokee, and on the south drumlin at North Cherokee. Despite the challenging fall weather (cool and wet) we managed to pull off a controlled burn at South Cherokee in a prairie and oak savanna units.

The Habitat Stewardship Committee approved Phase 2 (2014-2016) of the large scale oak savanna restoration initiative in the North Unit of Cherokee Marsh. Phase 1 canopy thinning will be completed in December 2013. A supplemental capital request for 2014 was approved allowing the project to move forward.

MALL CONCOURSE – TOM SKAIFE, SUPERVISOR; LAURA BAUER, LEADSWORKER

As December begins, the Mall/Concourse Maintenance staff is already clearing snow. The first snowfall, on November 25th, amounted to about two inches and provided a crucial training opportunity for our new crew members. Snow removal is truly an example of hands-on learning, and it's always nice to have a few easier snowfalls before we need to clear the several inches of wet, heavy snow that always seems to arrive eventually. With snow on the ground, daily maintenance of the sidewalks now includes checking crosswalks, bus shelters, and predictably icy areas - even on days when it hasn't snowed.

Seven sand barrels have been placed on State Street and around the Capitol Square, in the same general areas they've been the last two years. These locations seem to be working out well, but unfortunately we still need to check the barrels daily for trash.

We're also working to establish and maintain clear access to benches, bike racks, and trash cans.

Our leaf collection truck was changed over to a salt spreader just in time for the November snow. We use it to quickly spread the salt in large areas such as the Lower Mall, on the wide sidewalks around the Square, and in the alley connecting E. Washington and E. Mifflin. Use of this truck saves on the time-consuming production of refilling our larger salt wagon and ensures that the salt in the wagon will be available for use in our less mobile Toolcats.

We were able to replace our original Toolcat (one of the first in the city) with a new model this year. We're pleased with the new features and we look forward to having a more reliable piece of equipment.

The volume of recycling is decreasing with the colder weather as it always does in the winter months. We still need to do a collection at least twice a week, but this is much less than the daily collections of the summer months.

Winter banners were installed just in time for the Downtown Madison Holiday Open House at the end of November. Even though it's not technically winter yet, it definitely feels like it, and the banners are an attractive addition to the holiday decorations. They are also a nice compliment to the festive evergreens in the planter tubs, again installed by contractor Doug Duren of Lone Oak Interests.

OLBRICH GARDENS – ROBERTA SLADKY

Train show preparations are underway for the Holiday Express Flower and Model Train Show. The set-up will continue until opening day. With a candy theme, we expect that the show will dazzle everyone. Staff are creating 'candy' from everyday items. When you visit, see if you can tell what's real and what's imaginatively created!

I'm very proud of Olbrich Botanical Gardens staff who contributed \$670.00 to the Goodman Community Center's Thanksgiving basket fund drive.

As you know, Olbrich offers Explorer programs for elementary school classrooms that are tied to curriculum goals for the grade levels. These hours and numbers are incomplete because of the monthly report due date.

The biggest news in the month of November is that the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) was confirmed in Madison. This confirmation is the first find in Dane County which then Wisconsin Department of Ag, Trade & Consumer Protection (DATCP) placed the entire county under quarantine. Dane county becomes the 21st county in Wisconsin to have EAB. The location of the infestation is in the Warner Park area. Some suspicious larvae galleries were found in a private tree and reported to the Forestry Section. The Forestry Section began branch sampling in ash street and park trees within the area and found the actual EAB larvae. DATCP sent the specimen to Michigan for official confirmation (standard protocol). A press conference was held on November 26th at the Warner Park Community Recreation Center.

Earlier in the month both east and west completed fall planting. Then the east unit moved to pruning for upcoming 2014 engineering project for East Johnson Street as well as responding to work requests. And some small tree cycle pruning occurred within the isthmus.

The west unit had a little bit of request work but majority of their time was spent in cycle pruning and small tree cycle pruning. The small tree cycle pruning is where the 2004 tornado hit the city on the west side (Segoe and Tokay Blvd area) and many street trees were replanted. This will be the second time in eight years we have pruned the small trees in this part of the City.

Special projects for the month were:

- Tree removal in Tenney Park
- Cherokee Conservation pruning

The Forestry Specialists worked on laying out street trees on new plats, engineering projects and replacements. They also assisted in the review of tree cultivars to add to the approved street tree species list.

GOLF – VACANT

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT – KAY RUTLEDGE

Blackhawk Park

The shelter installation work for Blackhawk Park has started and the anticipated completion date is December 20th. Madison Commercial Landscapes is the contractor executing the work.

Central Park

Work continues to progress at Central Park. The primary pedestrian and bicycle paths have been surfaced, the restroom pavilion walls are constructed and are receiving the stone veneer facing, and the majority of the site fine grading is complete. The project is scheduled for substantial completion in December 2013. Construction of Phase 1B will not occur until 2014 due to delays from the railroad and the Federal/DOT requirements. A temporary crossing is being developed in order to correlate the necessary work with the railroad, in accordance with the OCR's recent supplemental order.

Highland Manor Park

The building design was approved by the neighborhood at a second input meeting on October 17th and then approved by the Urban Design Commission on October 23rd. The architect delivered 90% plans/specs to the City on November 26th for review. It is anticipated that plans and specifications will be out for bid in late January. Engineering is working in conjunction with a private contractor on the preparation of a building pad. Good granular fill material is being brought in for free from the Edgewater Hotel project site and stockpiled at Highland Manor. This material will replace problematic soils that will be removed in an effort to create a structurally sound building pad.

Splash Pads

SAA and staff are continuing on the design development for the Elver Park Splash Pad. The master plan revision to incorporate the splash pad was approved by the Park Commission on November 13th. 60% plans were received at the end of November and are under review. The Elver Splash Pad will be bid in the same contract with the Reindahl Splash Pad early next year.

Hoyt Park

Clearing and Phase 1 of the fence repairs was completed in November. Staff is working on the design for Phase 2 fence repairs to be completed Summer 2014.

Odana Golf Course

Installation of landscaping and berms is completed. A privacy fence between the Beltline and a section of the golf course will be installed in December.

Worthington Park Playground

Construction was completed on November 19th.

Reservoir Park Playground

Madison Commercial Landscapes has begun construction of the new playground with completion scheduled in November. Staff is also working with the Water Utility on the restoration plans to stabilize the slopes along the reservoir in conjunction with the construction of the new Booster Pump Station at Reservoir Park.

Warner Park Boat Launch Dredging

The dredging is scheduled to start in December after the boating season ends. All permits necessary for the project have been secured.

Breese Stevens Field Lighting/Sound System Improvements

The low bid was Pieper Electric at \$304,370, which was consistent with the project estimate. This project was originally scheduled for February – May 2014. The contractor requested to start early; construction is now scheduled to start at the end of November with a completion date of February 24, 2014.

Tenney Park Lagoon Control Structure

R.G. Huston Construction completed in the installation of the new control structure on November 15th and the lagoon water level has been raised to its skate season elevation. Punch list items have been addressed and the contract will be closed out.

Rennebohm Park Tennis Court Lighting Improvements

Construction is complete on the replacement of the tennis court lights with a punch list/walk thru to be completed the first week of December.

Bowman Field

Forward Electric has started installing the new conduit lines and lighting control panel at Bowman Field. The anticipated completion date for the work is December 15th. The project's first phase includes the installation of a new transformer, lighting control panel and conduit to the existing light poles. The second phase in 2014 will include new light fixtures and refurbishing the existing poles. During the interim between phases the field lights will continue to be served by the existing electrical system.

Brittingham Park at Proudfit

Construction was originally scheduled to occur this fall, but City Engineering and the Wisconsin Southern Railroad have raised concerns regarding the existing site drainage. Given the additional study required, it's anticipated the project will be constructed in early spring 2014 once the drainage issues are resolved.

Athletic Field Lighting Upgrades

Equipment to retrofit some of our athletic field lighting with "Control Link" – a program that will allow us to control (turn on/off) the lights from a computer terminal – has been ordered and is expected to arrive the first week of December. To start, we will be retrofitting the lighting systems for Elver softball and Demetral softball. Park Operations hopes to install the systems spring of 2014.

James Madison Park Shelter

Destree Design was hired to perform an assessment of the existing shelter at James Madison Park. The final report will include recommendations for three levels of improvements; shelter stabilization, current code requirements, and potential build-out improvements. Staff and Destree Design held a neighborhood input meeting on October 23rd. At this meeting a wide variety of opinions regarding improvements to the park and shelter were expressed. Parks staff is investigating the use of an on-line survey tool to reach a larger audience for input.

Basketball Court Reconstruction 2013

Staff packaged the reconstruction of 3 basketball courts (Acewood, Droster and Worthington Parks) into one public works contract for fall construction. The low bid was Raymond P. Cattell, Inc. at \$120,000.00. Work is completed on all 3 parks except for installation of the backboards/rims/nets. Waiting for frost to be in the ground so the newly seeded lawn won't be damaged to complete this work.

Westside Dog Parks

New dog parks have been approved for both Walnut Grove Park (the old skating area), and Odana School Park. Plans and specs for the fence and sidewalk installations at Odana went out for bid the first week of September; Joe Daniels Construction Co., Inc was low bid on the sidewalk at \$15,260.00. The sidewalk and fence have been installed. Our Construction Crew needs to add topsoil along a section of the fence to remove a gap caused by the uneven ground so small dogs cannot go under the fence.

Work by our Construction Crew on the Walnut Grove dog park late this fall was delayed due to the wet, snowy end of November. The Construction Crew will hopefully be able to start the grading work for this project early in 2014, with completion planned for summer of 2014.

Park Paving

Pobocki Paving completed the asphalt path projects at Westmorland Park and Washington Manor on November 14th.

Warner Park Bike Path

The project is 98% complete as of the end of November with a small amount of restoration work remaining. Staff is working on locations for additional benches and trees along the new path, to be installed in spring.

Forest Hill Cemetery

Masonry repairs have continued in 2013 for the buildings at Forest Hill Cemetery. Joe Daniels Construction completed work on the Chapel and the Receiving Vault. While the work on the Chapel is hold up well, some of the mortar applied on the Receiving Vault will need to be replaced as the temperatures were too cold for this work to bond correctly. This project is managed by City Facilities Management in partnership with Parks staff. We are also working with cemetery staff and Feick Design – an irrigation design company - to come up with a new waterline system for the cemetery.

Garner Park Masonry Repairs

The final phase of masonry repairs to the shelter has been completed at Garner Park. This project is managed by City Facilities Management in partnership with Parks staff.

Northland Manor Storm Sewer Replacement

Staff is working with City Engineering on a storm sewer replacement project in Northland Manor Park. The storm sewer project will be completed by Engineering staff; construction is nearing completion. This project has been approved administratively by the Parks Superintendent.

Garver Mill

The building condition study was presented to the Park Commission at their meeting in September; City Planning has been asked to prepare an RFP to hire a consultant to evaluate potential alternative uses for the building. The RFP will be brought back to the Park Commission in December/January. This project is managed by City Facilities Management in partnership with Parks staff.

Central Park Skatepark

The design consultant team, Stantec and MSA, have started working on preliminary concepts for the skatepark. An initial scoping meeting was held with Parks staff on November 21st; representatives of the Madison Skate Park Fund were also in attendance. A second design development meeting will be held in early December, with a public input meeting tentatively scheduled for December 19th. The project is anticipated to go out for bid in late May 2014.

Tenney Park – Marston Bridge

A request for proposals went out in July to hire a consultant to develop plans and specifications to restore the Marston Avenue Bridge in Tenney Park. Strand Associates was selected and has been out at the site investigating the existing condition of the bridge, including evaluating the rebar as well as concrete testing. Staff has been working closely with Amy Scanlon, City Historic Preservation Planner, and the State Historical Society to ensure the project is completed according to their specifications. Staff will present this project at a future Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Association meeting.

Olbrich Park Canoe Launch

Staff is working with City Engineering on a canoe launch at Olbrich Park near the canoe racks. This is a 2014 Capital Budget project that will be managed by City Engineering in partnership with Parks staff.

Yahara River Bank Stabilization

Staff is working with City Engineering on improvements to the Yahara River to stabilize the stream bank where the existing wooden retaining walls are deteriorating. The section from Rutledge Street to Jenifer Street, along the eastern shore, has been identified for spot improvements. This project is managed by City Engineering in partnership with Parks staff.

Sauk Creek Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Sauk Creek Park. Staff held a Public Input Meeting on November 11th to discuss the proposed playground project. Staff has been working with the playground manufacturer selected by the neighborhood and will present two playground concepts on December 19th.

Haen Family Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Haen Family Park. Staff will hold a Public Input Meeting on December 2nd to discuss the proposed playground project.

Droster Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Droster Park. Staff will hold a Public Input Meeting on December 2nd to discuss the proposed playground project.

Pilgrim Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Pilgrim Park. Staff will hold a Public Input Meeting on December 10th to discuss the proposed playground project.

Everglade Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Everglade Park. Staff will hold a Public Input Meeting on December 11th to discuss the proposed playground project.

Westport Meadows Park Playground

Staff has begun initial design development for replacement of the existing playground at Westport Meadows Park. Staff will hold a Public Input Meeting on December 18th to discuss the proposed playground project.

Breese Stevens Field Artificial Turf

Parks Division staff prepared and sent out a request for proposal (RFP) in early November to hire a consultant to prepare plans and specifications for this project. We received 9 proposals on November 15th. A consultant will be selected by early December so we can be out for bid as soon as possible in spring 2014.

2014 Park Landscaping

Staff has begun initial design development for the 2014 Park Landscaping Project. The contract is expected to be advertised for bid in late January.

Bill Kettle Field

City staff have been working with Dane County regarding the expansion of the landfill (Bill Kettle Field is located along the northeastern edge of the landfill). Due to the expansion, additional land is needed and Dane County would like to purchase Bill Kettle Field to expand the landfill to the east and relocate their stormwater ponds to the north and south. Dane County will also purchase a portion of the property owned by the Streets Division along the southeastern edge of the landfill, along with easements needed to complete the landfill expansion and stormwater-related improvements. Real Estate is exploring the best way to value the property for potential purchase by Dane County. Parks staff have begun discussions with user groups regarding potential opportunities to move their activity to other locations.

Other Projects

- The Parks Division was awarded a \$167,364.00 Stewardship grant from the Department of Natural Resources for the acquisition of land to expand Merrill Springs Park. The grant amount will be used to offset City funds that were used for this acquisition.
- Worked with City Engineering on a shoreline restoration project at Paunack Park. Work has been completed.
- Staff is working with neighborhood representatives and volunteers to coordinate improvements for a variety of parks including Reynolds Park, James Madison Park, Spring Harbor Park, Nakoma Park and Linden Grove Park.
- Participated in Neighborhood Resource Teams and/or Neighborhood Development Plans for Owls Creek, Arbor Hills/Leopold, University/Hill Farms and Hoyt Park.
- Parks lighting projects are underway to replace lighting with more energy-efficient fixtures. Replacements have been completed at Olbrich Botanical Complex, Brittingham, and Goodman Building B. This project is managed by City Facilities Management in partnership with Parks staff; Parks Operations staff are replacing the fixtures as the new fixtures arrive.
- Staff is working on the design and specifications for installation of a topsoil shed at Goodman Maintenance Facility.
- Starting to work on the paving contract for 2014. Trying various combinations of the work in an attempt to find out what is the best way to package the variety of work we have in 2014 to get the best prices.
- Met with a representative of the Lucia Crest Neighborhood Association regarding the possibility of adding an "edible landscaping" area in Lucia Crest Park.

COMMUNITY SERVICES – VACANT

The following Ranger reports for the month of October were submitted by Weekend Ranger Supervisor Josh Schmitt.

As you can see from the report things were calming down in the parks during this October and our contact numbers were also down. Our shelter closures were completed by Nov 1st, and nightly shelter checks by Rangers shifted to a weekly area check of the facility during daylight to check for maintenance issues. We have 3 remaining Badger home games (two after today) and the results of the enforcement is evident in the decreased citations and increased Parking for Park users.

For the month of November we are at minimum staffing and shifting our focus toward our yearly projects. I am able to delegate more work, begin planning for the next summer season and get a lot of our behind the scenes work done.
