

Madison Streatery Program - State Street Guide 6-30-20

The Streatery Program - State Street Specifics - Weekend Only Closure

- Dates: Friday July 3 through August 23
- Times: Fridays from 6:35 pm through Monday Morning 5:15 am
- Location 100-600 Blocks of State Street

City Responsibilities:

1. Traffic Engineering Staff:
 - Traffic Engineer will authorize closure of the 100-600 Blocks of State Street as a test to determine effects of a full pedestrian State Street Mall.
 - Traffic Engineering Staff will deliver barricades to area starting July 3rd – and retrieve them at the end of the program
2. Parks Mall Maintenance Staff:
 - Will paint lines illustrating the 20' fire lane in the middle of street
3. Metro Transit: Will re-route and sign all Metro Routes affected by this closure

Conditions for State Street Streatery:

1. 20 foot fire lane must be maintained clear at all times
2. All ADA sidewalk access maintained to each business
3. State Street Businesses need to maintain a welcoming atmosphere for all residents of the downtown.
4. All restaurants, bars and merchants must follow current Public Health Madison Dane County orders.
5. Any protests, marches and other free speech events may continue to use the space and fire lanes as requested/permitted.
6. This program may be ended at any time, for any reason, by the City Traffic Engineer, Fire Chief or Police Chief.

BID Responsibilities: The BID will take out a Street Occupancy Permit on behalf of the entire Street.

Requirements for Restaurants/Taverns & Bars:

1. Businesses must have a valid Sidewalk Café License (no fees in 2020)
2. Must have an extension of Premises for Alcohol
3. Streatery rules for 2020 apply
4. All equipment must be brought in each evening
5. Patrons must be seated and maintain physical distancing per PHMDC orders.

Requirements for Retailers/Merchants:

1. Businesses must have a Merchant Vending License (no fees for 2020)
2. All normal Merchant Vending rules apply
3. All equipment must be brought in each evening
4. Traffic barriers must be removed to allow busses by Monday at 5:15am
