Conditions for Paddle & Portage, James Madison, Law, and Olin Parks, July 21, 2012, sponsored by Isthmus Publishing

Staff recommends approval, based on Isthmus's agreement to the following conditions:

- 1. Aldermanic notification.
- Organizers will review their site plans with the East and West Parks
 Supervisors, and agrees to comply with all site recommendations made by
 them.
- 3. Any beer sales or serving will be contained in a double-fenced beer garden. Sponsor will meet with Parks Staff and Police to discuss security issues in connection with the sale of beer, and will follow all Parks and Police requirements.

4. Isthmus will provide a certificate of insurance covering this event, including liquor liability, and naming the City of Madison as "additional insured."

- 5. Organizers will post a \$3,000 damage deposit with the Parks Division prior to the event and acknowledges that their organization will be responsible for any and all actual field renovation costs which may result from this event.
- 6. Amplification will be allowed at James Madison and Olin Parks between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., but sound must be kept to a reasonable level, particularly earlier in the morning.
- 7. No vehicles will be driven or parked on the grass.
- 8. The organizers will be responsible for all clean-up of the Olin shelter and all of the park areas you use during your event.
- 9. Fees will be paid, and the insurance and deposit will be on file in the Park Office at least one week prior to the event.
- 10. If any tents are set up in the parks, the organizers will contact Digger's Hotline approximately ten days before the event date, and will then contact the Park Office to relay the Ticket Number.
- Organizers will apply for a Temporary Restaurant Permit, a Street-Use Permit, a Parade Permit, and a Temporary Class B Retailer's License application.
- 12. Organizers will be responsible for picking up keys to the Olin Pavilion a few days before the race.
