LIBRARY SITING AND ALLOCATION (BP) (CR) (EL)

Pinney Project:

We have started meeting to go over proposed dates for completing the project and the projected opening. A major concern is to make sure we can minimize our time in the interim space since this additional cost takes away from our building project. In the meantime, the construction continues and the defined space are becoming evident.

Imagination Center (IC) at Reindahl Park:

The original amendment made at Finance Committee involving the project remains. The ask to move the IC from the Mayor's Horizon Project List back to the CIP will be decided in the final Common Council adoption process.

Kevin conducted his first Local Voices Network session with neighborhood residents about the project. He received some feedback from one of the participants that I wanted to share with the Board.

Subject: Thank You

Hi Kevin,

I wanted to thank you for taking the time to meet with us and truly listen to our community. We really appreciate it! After our conversation last night I got so excited about this project that I had to share some of my reflections with you. Sorry this is so long!

After reflecting on your question about our community identity, I truly believe that is something that we are missing. We are a community that is cut off by large roads and disconnected from the amenities of Madison and surrounding areas. East Town Mall, chain restaurants and the airport also break up our neighborhoods without providing community space. This library would give our area something to be proud of and I believe could help us to connect, bring together resources, ideas and people to build a needed network and gain respect for this area.

I also think the library could bring exciting options to improve the park. The park has the potential to better serve our community and enhance the space. I think adding to the park through ideas such as a water feature or pond (could have fishing), bike paths, dream park playground, pool, dog park, reading tree house, ice skating, flower gardens, dog park, bath paths and recreational rentals etc. could make it a desirable and destination space. I also think exploring how the space could express and create art, music, theater, food would really embrace the imagination center idea. This could bring events such as movie nights, concerts, food and craft festivals, etc. which is something our area is also lacking.

One of the needs close to my heart is bringing resources to the community members here most in need. Being so close to the interstate makes us an accessible location for drug dealing and using. With this, we also have members in our community struggling with addiction and homelessness at the parks and surrounding hotels and neighborhoods. I believe bringing services such as a resource specialist, needle exchange/public health program, social worker, mental health, housing, etc. could radically support these community members.

This library will be so much more for this community as I believe we have a desperate need for a neighborhood center and space as well. I think doing some volunteer coordinating and asset mapping could provide some untapped potential here such as childcare volunteers, Zumba/yoga teachers, artists, musicians, chefs, gardeners, teachers and social workers who could contribute to this center. I also believe the library will bring access to community members in need such as books, internet, social events, and social services to those who are underserved. I also hope it will bring existing community resources such as benefit workers, American Family DreamBank, community caseworkers and programs to diversify options at low or no cost to the project.

The community kitchen and cafe idea is exciting as I can imagine a patio surrounded in plants and gardens maintained by the community and giving people a beautiful spot to enjoy a drink, ice cream or connect. Bringing a local vibe to this community is so needed as well as a way for our cut off communities to connect.

Thank you again and we are so excited about the future of this project! I can't say enough how much I believe this will impact our area and the future possibles are so exciting for me as I dream about building up the untapped parts of our community. Thanks for taking the time to hear all my ideas!

WISCONSIN BOOK FESTIVAL (CR)

We completed our 7th WBF since reopening Central Library and it continues to grow and improve each year. In addition to having C-SPAN's BookTalk back again at the fest, we had a special surprise for the audiences at the *For Colored Girls Who Have Considered Politics* and *Real Queer America* sessions. Everyone in attendance at these two events received a free copy of the book. This was made possible by the generous donation to the WBF by the Cheryl Rosen Weston estate. It was truly an "Oprah moment" for the audience and the authors were also very surprised. Another fun note from this year's WBF, my office was used as the "green room" and several of the authors were impressed by Central's green roof but none more so than Ben Folds, the musician and author. It was almost the only thing he talked or asked about prior to his presentation.

We don't have the final numbers yet on the 4 days of events, but I will provide an update when I have that information.

BUDGET UPDATE

Finance Committee met on October 21 to determine their final recommendation to the Common Council for their consideration and adoption on Nov. 12th. There were 27 amendments presented at the meeting, but none of them concerned the Library. So we will go into the final stage of budget approval with the Mayor's supplemental additions intact.

ULC ANNUAL FORUM (CR)

It is always interesting to attend this annual event where ULC distributes the Innovation Awards and focuses presentations on a particular topic. This year's topic was Artificial Intelligence (AI). Both of those features of the forum were somewhat overshadowed by continuous discussion about the Macmillan e-book embargo. The discussion ranged from a boycott of Macmillan's electronic resources, to more negotiations, to pushing for legislation to prevent this from happening. So far MPL has signed various petitions including Mayor Satya signing the ULC petition condemning the practice. The embargo begins on November 1st, so we will know very soon what the impact of this action will mean to MPL's e-book users.

In other news at the Forum, unfortunately MPL did not receive any of the Innovation Awards this year, but our work with the Local Voices Network was recognized in the AI discussions. Charlotte Mecklenburg Library contacted me to ask for an introduction to Cortico, so they might explore the LVN platform. I was also approached by St. Paul Public Library and Skokie Public Library to discuss our progress on our RESJ work.

LIBRARY DIRECTORS' SUMMIT & KNIGHT MEDIA FORUM (CR)

I will be attending the Library Journal's Directors' Summit from November 6-8, in Tulsa, OK. In addition to the several presentations (And probably more discussion about the Mac Embargo) I will have the opportunity to view for my first time Tulsa's new Central Library designed by MSR, the same architectural firm that worked on our Central Library. Tulsa staff came to our Central Library when they were developing their design to draw on our experience and I'm sure borrow some of our building ideas.

I was honored to be invited back to the Knight Media Forum. This forum in February of 2020 always introduces some the leading edge ideas about media and discusses the latest intellectual freedom issues.

VISIT FROM KANIFING'S LORD MAYOR BENSOUDA (CR) (BP)

Madison's sister city in The Gambia is Kanifing and Lord Mayor Talib Bensouda came to Madison to attend the annual Kanifing Sister City Dinner. He was joined by a member of his council and a member of his personal staff. In addition to the dinner, the Mayor of Kanifing met with Mayor Satya on the following Monday to share his relationship with our city and to discuss the public library project he hopes to complete in his city. On Tuesday MPL hosted a press conferences with both Mayors, Alder Baldeh, Chair of the Madison/Kanifing Sister City group, and myself to announce the plans to work together on the Kanifing Public Library project.
