WHEREAS, Sid Boyum (now deceased), is a renowned local artist and sculpture, who resided on the east side of the City of Madison and who has been nationally recognized for his contribution to public sculpture in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the family of Sid Boyum desire to donate thirteen (13) outdoor sculptures to the City, having an appraised value of approximately \$250,000 and being the largest multiple-piece donation of artwork to the City, and relocate the sculptures in designated public places in the Schenk-Atwood neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the specific sculptures and locations were selected by a neighborhood voting process and reflect a broad based neighborhood enthusiasm for the project which has been endorsed by the recent Schenk-Atwood-Worthington Neighborhood Plan; and

WHEREAS, the owners, as represented by Lou Host-Jablonski, AIA of Design Coalition Inc. and Tony Rajer, art conservator and neighborhood resident, in coordination with Steven Boyum (Sid Boyum's son) have met with staff members of the City Parks Division and CitiARTS Commission and requested permission to place the sculptures in public property in and about the bike path, street rights-of-way and parks in the Schenk-Atwood neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, an endowment fund is being created to provide a maintenance budget for the sculptures, which are of concrete, durable and will be fully restored after final installation; and

WHEREAS, the family of Sid Boyum will transfer ownership of the sculptures to the City after they are installed; and

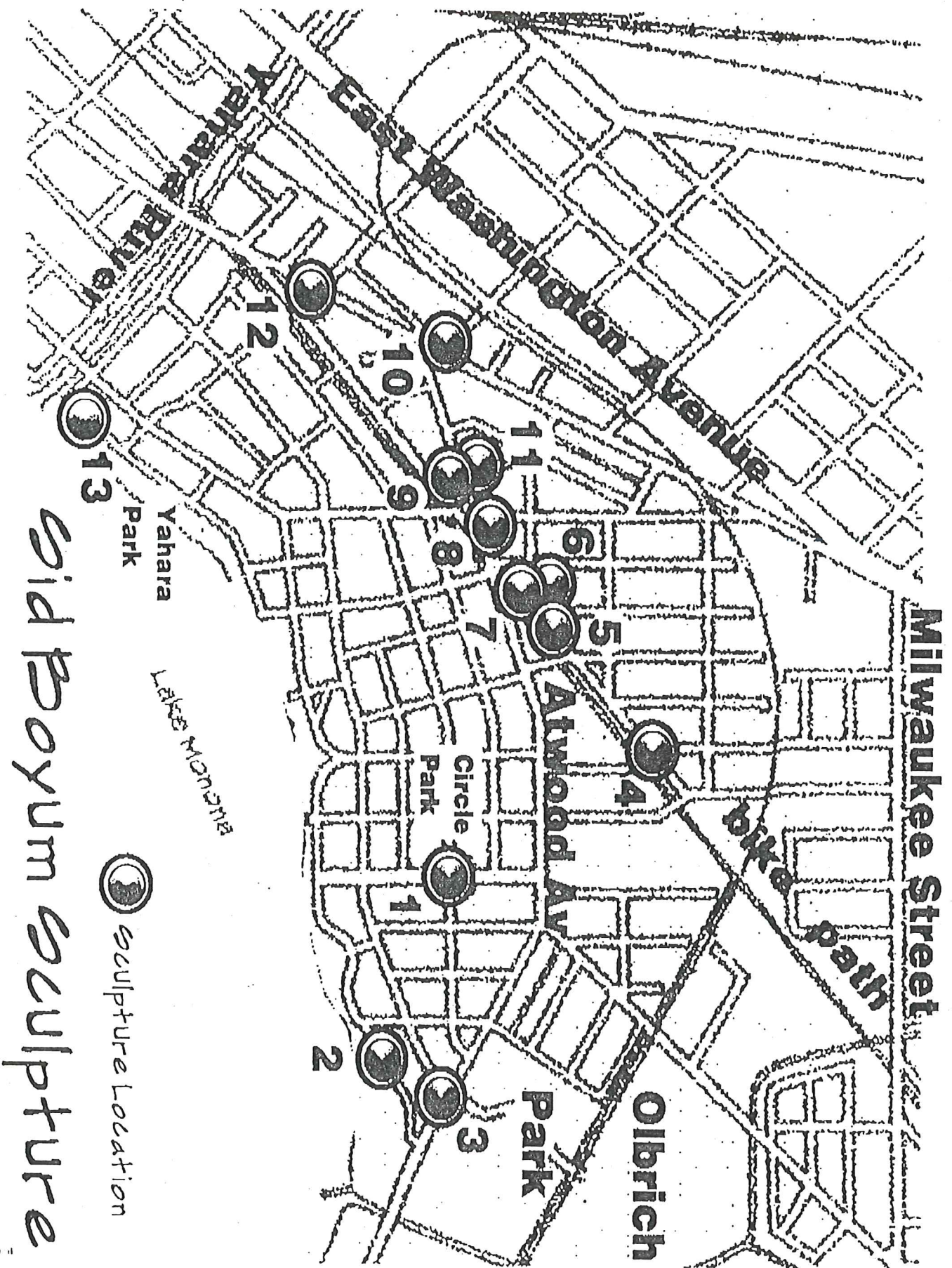
WHEREAS, the Privilege in Streets Committee will be reviewing this request and the specific locations of the sculptures with respect to transportation purposes, public safety, long-term planning and maintenance issues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Madison accepts ownership, from the Sid Boyum family, of the thirteen (13) outdoor sculptures located in public property in the Schenk-Atwood neighborhood, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Sid Boyum Endowment, in conjunction with Design Coalition Inc. ("Endowment"), shall pay all costs for construction and long-term maintenance of the sculptures, said sculptures and their specific locations being subject to City review.
2. The Endowment, shall locate the sculptures in the public property, as approved by the City Transportation Department and Parks Division.
3. The Endowment is responsible for locating all underground utility services in the construction areas.
4. The Endowment shall comply with all Madison General Ordinances regarding the construction and installation of the sculptures.
5. The City may remove the sculptures if not properly maintained, by giving the Endowment thirty (30) days written notice prior to removal. The Endowment is responsible for any reasonable costs associated with such removal.
6. The City may remove the sculptures if the area occupied by the said sculptures is required for transportation purposes, by giving the Endowment thirty (30) days written notice prior to removal. Transportation purposes include, without limitation because of enumeration, public alleys, streets, highways, bike paths, sidewalks, and facilities for the development, improvement and use of public mass transportation systems.

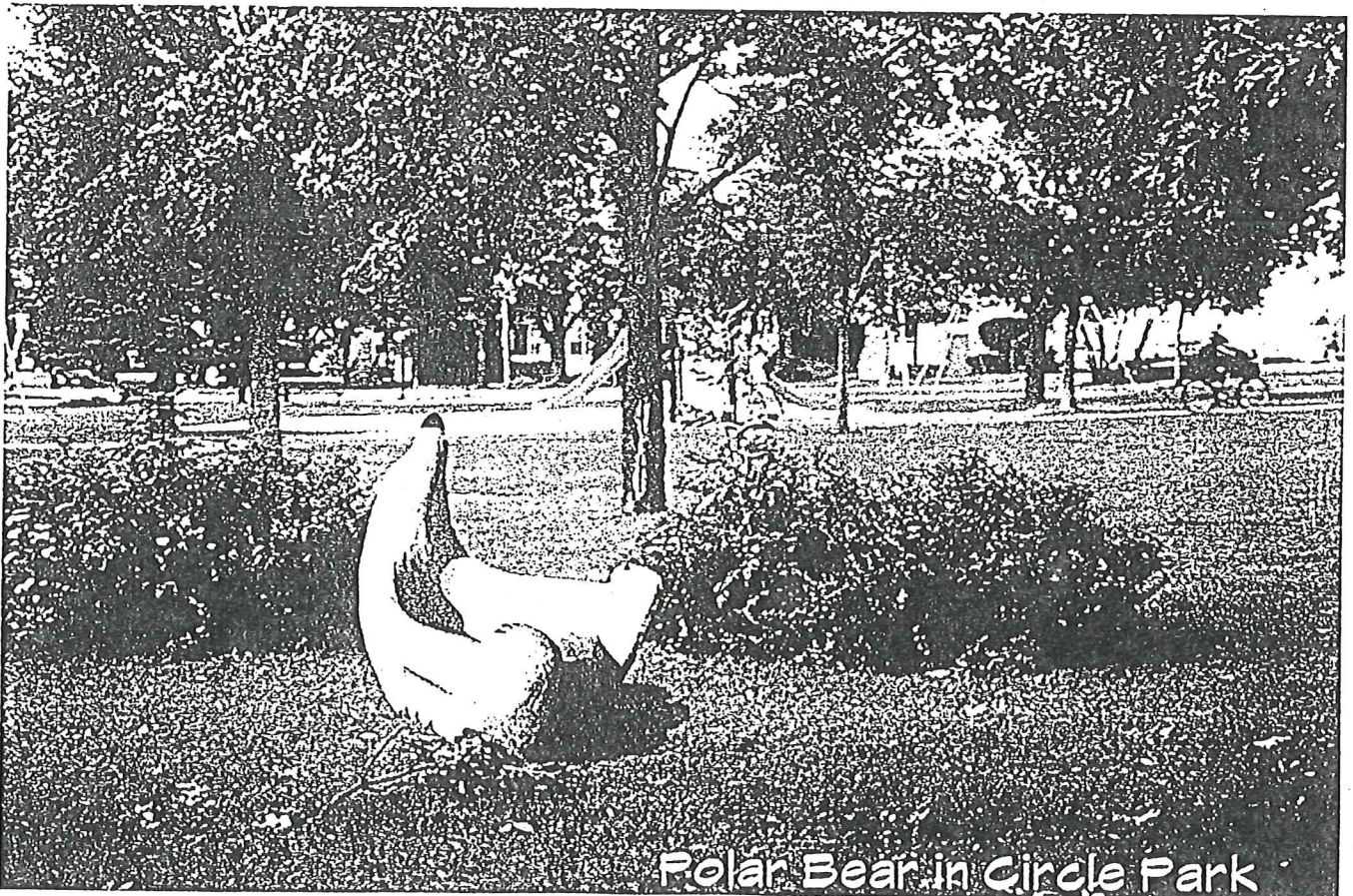

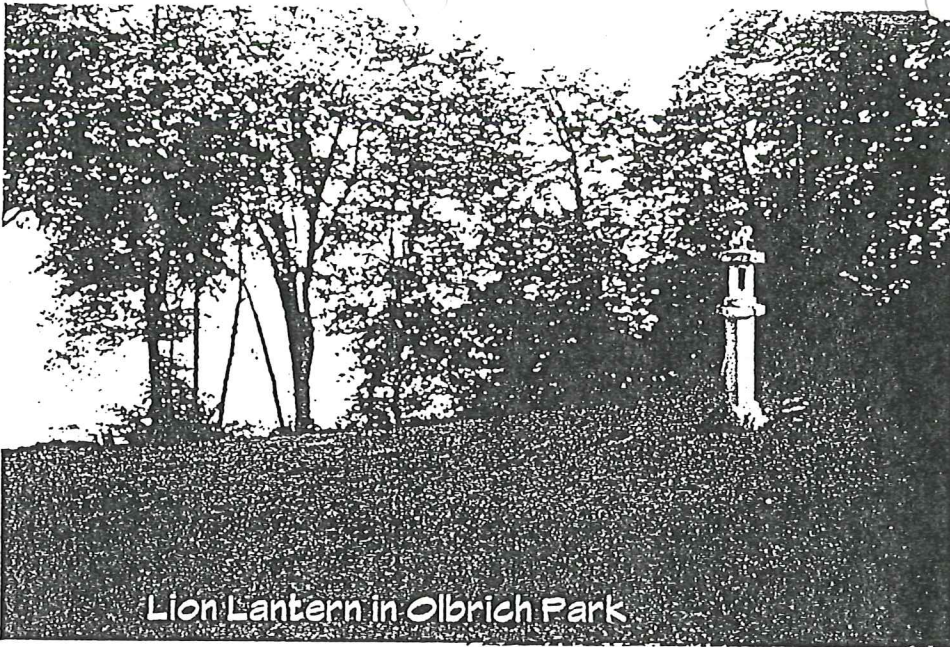

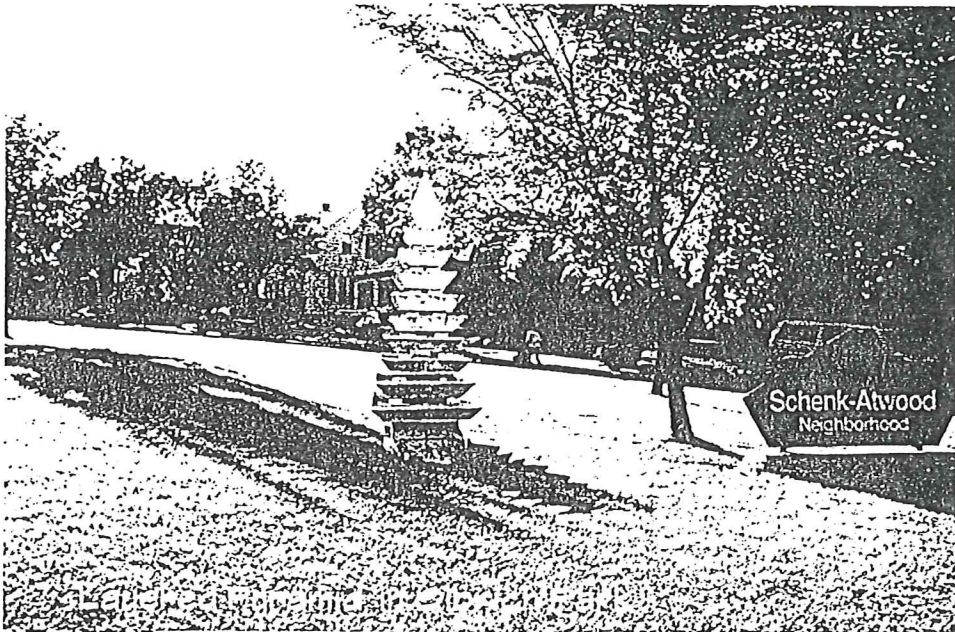


Polar Bear in Circle Park



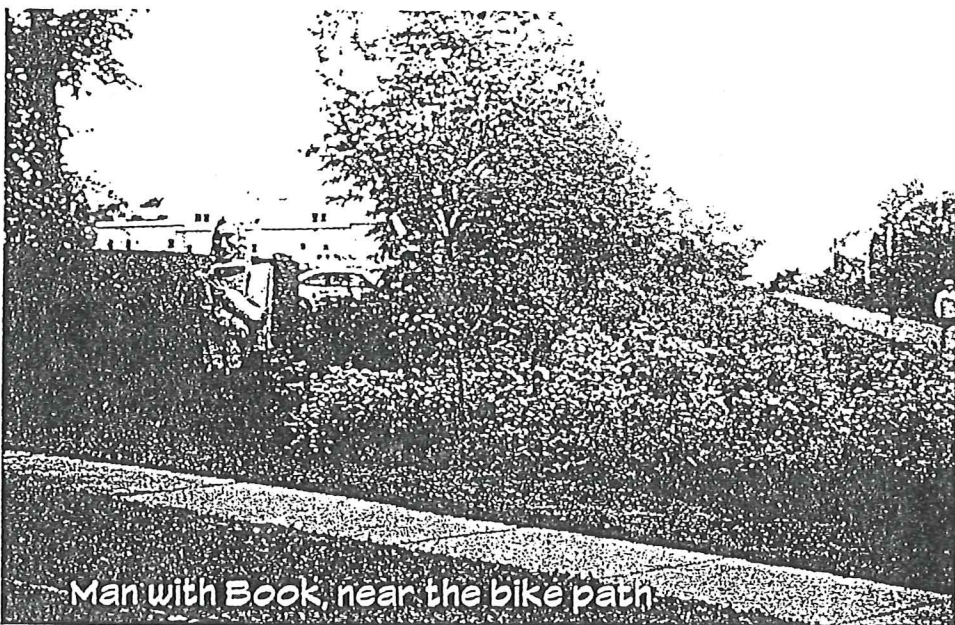
Lion Lantern in Olbrich Park

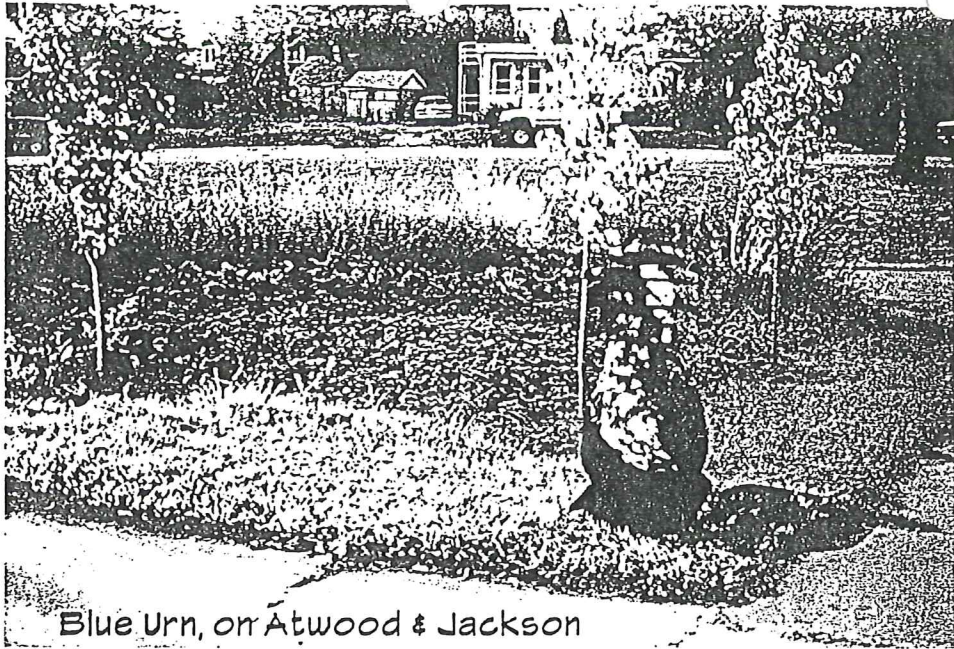

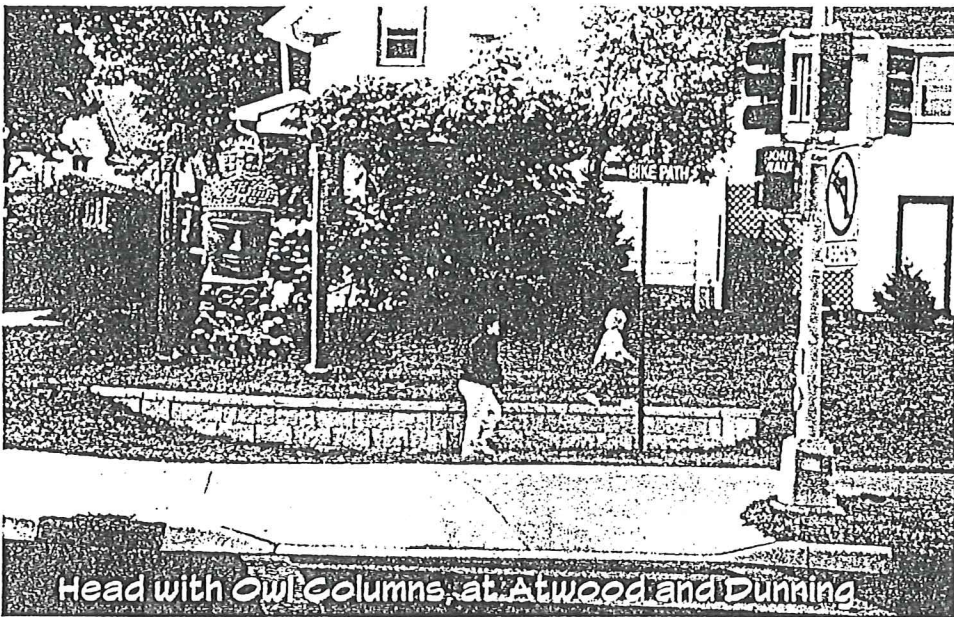
Man with Book, near the bike path

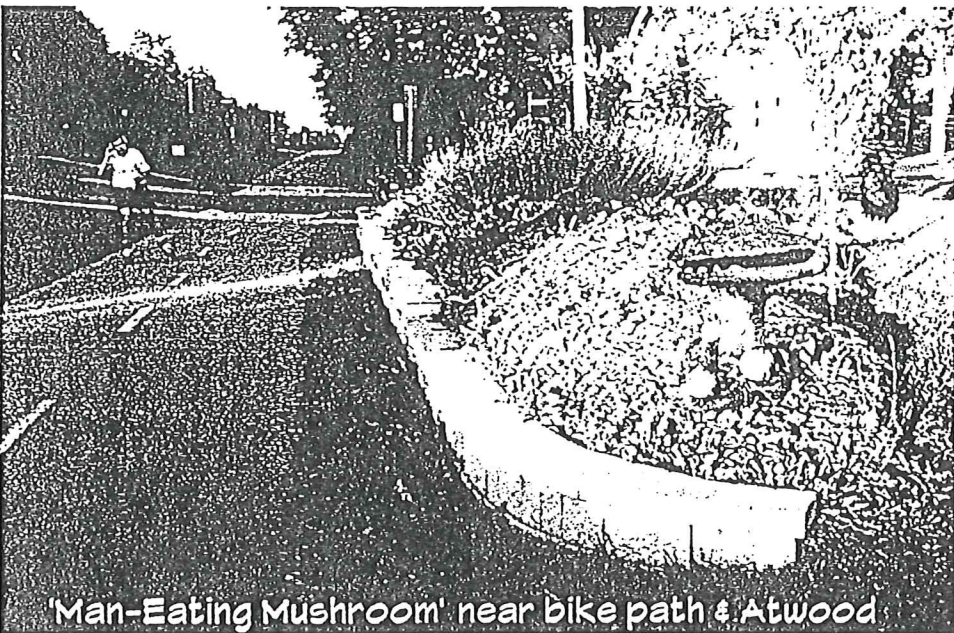
Blue Urn, on Atwood & Jackson

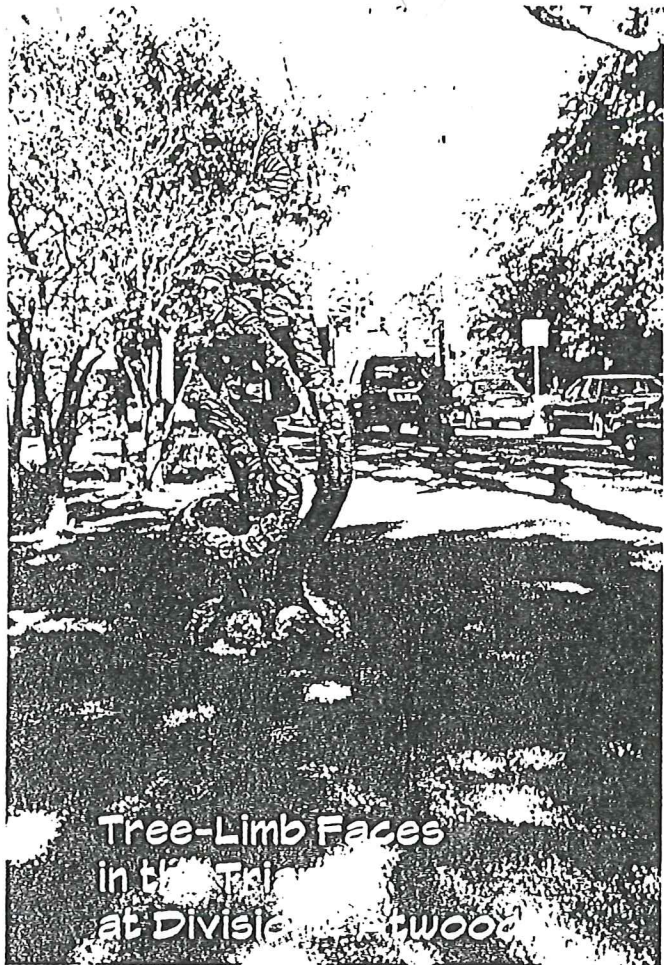
Head with Owl Columns, at Atwood and Dunning

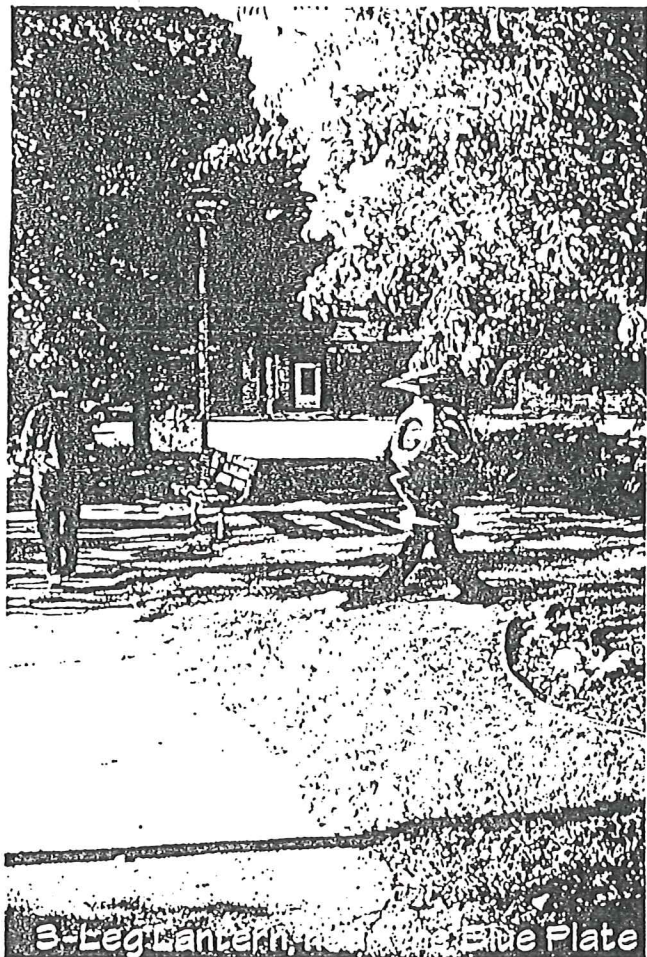

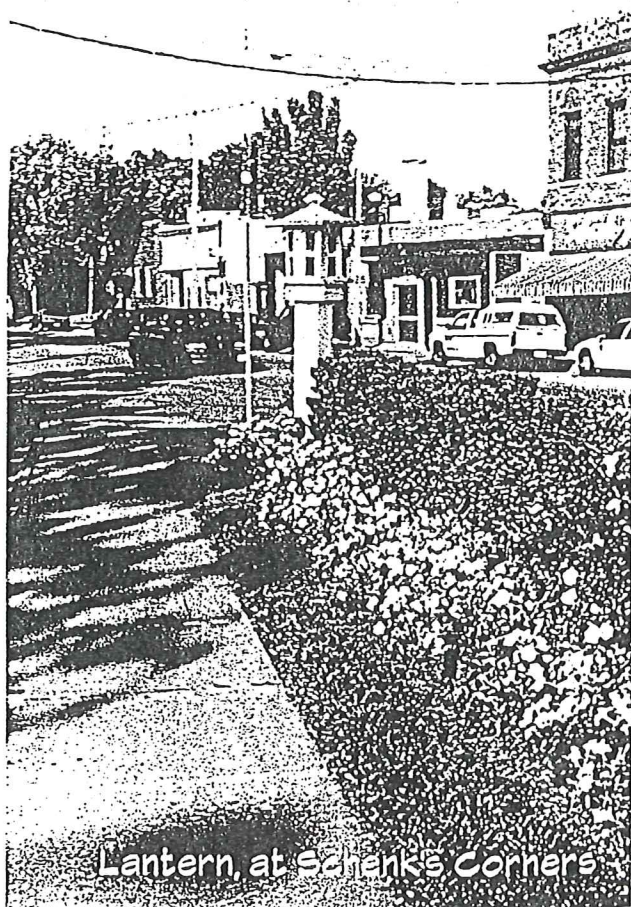

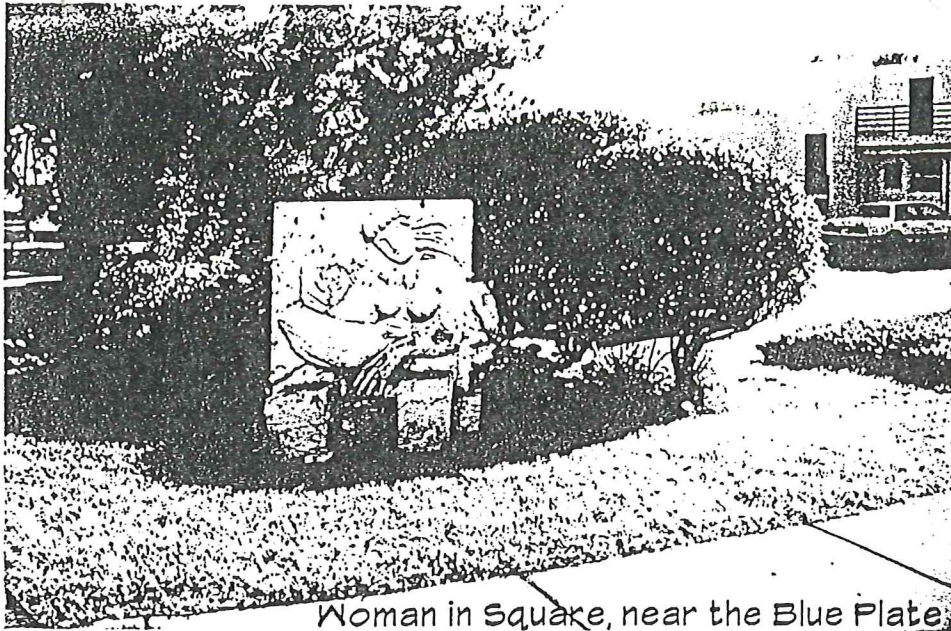

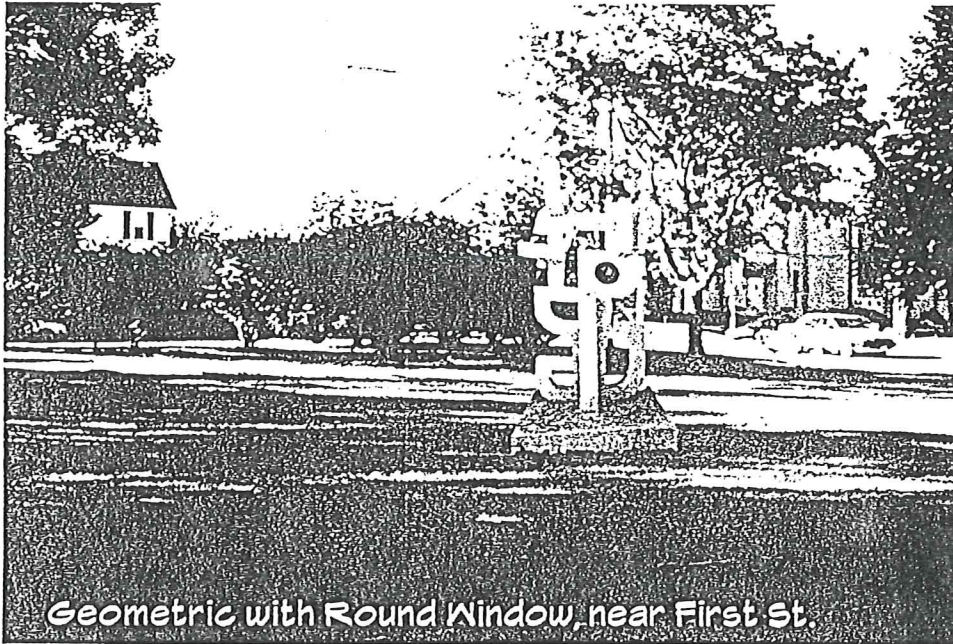

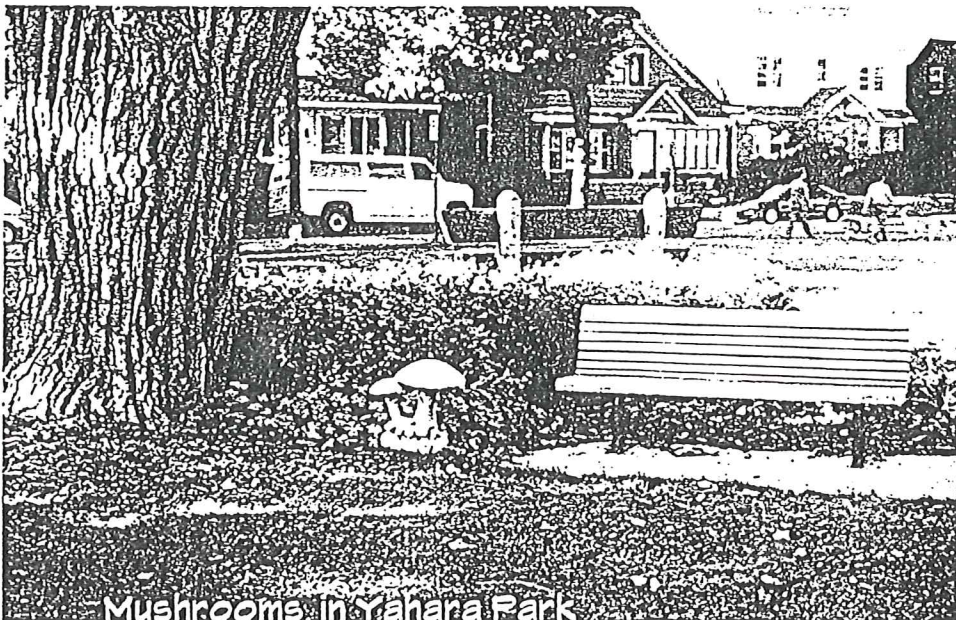
