### REPORTS

1. <u>14289</u>

Greater Madison Convention and Visitors Bureau First Quarter Report - Deb Archer, President, GMCVB

The first quarter business reflected the troubled economy:

Contracts have been signed for two conventions and one conference; the goal for 2009 is a total of 42 contracts (30 conventions, 12 conferences).
Four contracts are pending year-to-date, totaling \$146,000+ in contract revenue.

- Total lead prospects for the first quarter are excellent at 75 year-to-date, the highest amount of first quarter leads in six years; there were 40 Monona Terrace leads.

- The direct spending impact for confirmed events is approximately \$4,900,000.

- First quarter publicity value is \$41,000, and the annual goal totals \$500,000. - The GMCVB is working hard on attracting additional biotech business, and the excellent health care that is available in Madison is also a strong market. Meetings will be held with staff from local hospitals to discuss the possibility of partnering on promoting Madison as a health care destination (health care is one of one of top ten reasons people travel to the Madison area).

- Staff members from the GMCVB and Monona Terrace will meet on May 15 to discuss Best Practices.

		Mr. DiCarlo made a motion to accept the slate as presented, seconded by Mr. Onken. The motion was approved by voice vote / other.
3.	<u>14291</u>	Finance Report - Kathi Hurtgen, Director of Finance
		Revenues for the month of March were +8%, year-to-date revenues were -2%. Expenditures were -5% for the month, -6% year-to-date. Revenue over expenditures for the month were +\$53,000, +84,000 year-to-date. Expenses were less because overtime is being carefully monitored, there was less snow than normal this winter, and electricity costs were lower.
4.	<u>14292</u>	2009 Booking Pace Update - Bill Zeinemann, Director of Marketing and Events
		<ul> <li>Monona Terrace has experienced some event cancellations due to the economy, and deposits have been retained when appropriate; revenues from those events would have totaled \$213,000.</li> <li>Weddings are holding steady at 113, and four weddings have cancelled which is very unusual.</li> <li>There are 28 conventions on the books, equaling the forecasted number, and 33 conferences (40 were budgeted); three conferences are holding space.</li> <li>Year-end revenues are projected to be -5.5% when compared to budget.</li> <li>The sales staff is working hard to book additional business.</li> <li>Ms. Lemke, Director of Monona Catering, reported their projected revenue for 2009 is \$6,100,000, and added that because of the weak economy, this would be \$800,000 less than 2008 revenues.</li> </ul>
5.	<u>11917</u>	Director's Report - Jim Hess, Director
		<ul> <li>Board Report: There were no questions on the Board Report.</li> <li>Hotel Update: Conversations between Marcus Hotels and the City of Madison are still progressing. The Monona Terrace Board may be asked for a support statement regarding the hotel.</li> <li>High-speed rail for the region is becoming more of a possibility with Madison being mentioned as a stop in the rail corridor. The State prefers that the station would be located at the airport rather than in the downtown area. If high-speed does become a reality, commuter rail may also. Board members indicated an interest in further discussion about this topic at a future meeting.</li> <li>Chicago is in the running to be awarded the 2016 Olympic Games. If that occurs, the cycling events may take place in Wisconsin; site selection will take place in October. Board members also want to discuss this in greater detail at a future meeting.</li> </ul>
