**The purpose** of this project is to acquire a Sid Boyum sculpture and create a new sculpture garden with perennial bed at the entrance of our neighborhood park, Carpenter-Ridgeway Park. Mr. Boyum was a local eastside sculpture who created many interesting and unique sculptures. The new bed will include the sculpture, a small plaque describing the artist and sculpture, new perennials, grasses, and small shrubs. This new sculpture garden will be accessible and visible to the general public, and will be designed to be low maintenance. Bill Bauer from Parks will help design the new garden. This project will be managed by the Carpenter-Ridgeway Neighborhood Association, with Randy Glysck taking the lead on the management of the project. The maintenance of the bed will be the responsibility of volunteers from the neighborhood association, and the ongoing maintenance of the sculpture will be covered by the Boyum maintenance fund. The construction of the new garden will begin as soon as a contract is signed with the city, and construction of the new garden will be completed by the end of summer 2008. We have several collaborators, supporters, and sponsors of this project, including the City of Madison Parks Department, the Boyum Family, East Madison Community Center, Cub & Boy Scout Troop 5 from Maple Bluff, Youth Services of Southern Wisconsin, and garden tour sponsors.

**Community Benefit** - Our neighborhood park, open space, natural areas, and previous new gardens continue to add an important element to the quality of life of Carpenter-Ridgeway neighborhood residents. This is a project that benefits many beyond our immediate neighborhood. This new sculpture garden will become a treasure for the Carpenter-Ridgeway Neighborhood, but it will also be shared with anyone who visits the neighborhood and park area. This new sculpture garden will continue to improve the overall appearance of the neighborhood and park area.

**Neighborhood Participation** - The actual building of the new sculpture garden will be accomplished with neighborhood volunteers and youth groups. As part of fundraising for this project, we propose to hold a Neighborhood Garden Tour on Saturday, June 28th, 2008. The Garden Tour has multiple purposes. The first being to help raise funds to acquire the Boyum sculpture and to construct a new perennial bed for the new sculpture. Secondly, it encourages our neighborhood residents to come out and support our efforts to build this new garden. Thirdly, in addition to having eight private gardens on the tour, we propose to showcase some of the public gardens and green space that were built in the neighborhood with past CEP grants. By adding the public gardens and green spaces to the tour, we hope to provide ideas and examples for other city neighborhoods. We have great sponsorship for the garden tour from Wisconsin Landscapes, Inc., Willy Street Co-op, Johannsen's, Klein's Nursery, Associated Bank, the Bruce Company, and The Flower Factory.

**Financial Capability/Budget** - The neighborhood will be holding a garden tour fundraiser event on June 28, 2008. Our hope is to raise \$500 from the event. If we do not raise the \$500, the neighborhood association will cover an amount up to \$500 additional costs. In addition, we are providing 40 hrs of volunteer labor. All previous grants will be completed prior to approval of this project.

**Consistency with Adopted Plans & Policies** - This project is consistent with adopted plans & policies - (Pg. 17 of the Carpenter-Hawthorne-Ridgeway-Sycamore-Truax Neighborhood Plan Recommendations) "Improve the accessibility, usability and function of existing parks and open spaces areas, including the entrance and overall appearance of the parkland."


Dear Mr. Glysch:


Dear City of Madison Planning Division,

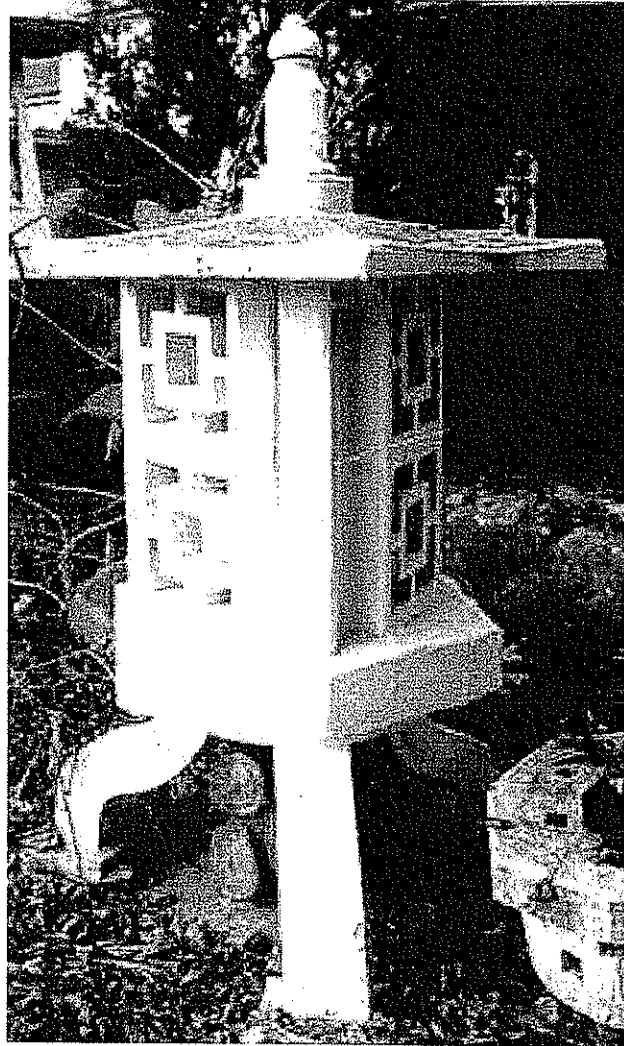
