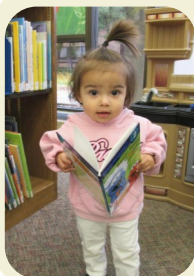

By the Numbers

WISCONSIN RESIDENTS USE LIBRARIES

- ◆ 61 **million** physical items checked out (averaging 1.2 million per week; 37% children's materials)
- ◆ 1.6 **million** eBooks downloaded
- ◆ 130 **million** Badgerlink searches conducted

Wisconsin has one of the nation's largest and most active collection of eBooks and digital audio books.

FREE WI-FI

99% of public libraries offer **free** Wi-Fi

For **most** Wisconsin communities, the Public Library is the **primary place** for access to hi-speed Internet.
