The developer, Archipelago Village, LLC, has received the City of Madison's conditional approval for the construction of a 15-story, 265-room hotel with a food and beverage uses and outdoor eating area at 929 E Washington Avenue. This is a planned multi-use site which contains a 144-room hotel, a five-story office building, and a 380-stall shared parking structure. With this project, the developer shall be responsible for the construction of a northbound turn lane at the intersection of S Paterson Street and E Washington Avenue. Additional work related to the turn lane shall include the removal and replacement of pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalk, traffic lights, a fire hydrant, storm inlets, signing, and pavement markings. The developer shall be responsible for the protection of City fiber optic lines in the terrace behind the curb along E Washington Avenue. The developer shall provide a deposit for pedestrian lighting on E Main Street and S Paterson Street, shall be responsible for existing concrete bus pads along the E Washington Avenue frontage, construction repair of sidewalk, curb and gutter, and pavement along the E Washington Avenue corridor adjacent to the project, and private lateral connections to serve the new building. City Forestry has approved the removal of a 5" diameter hackberry tree and a 7" diameter pear tree along the E Washington Avenue frontage. Both conflict with new buried utilities. The developer shall be responsible for the cost of new tress upon the completion of construction. All other trees shall be protected.

The Fordem Ave. – First Street Relief Sewer project is to replace a 12" cast iron sewer installed in 1946 under the railroad tracks at 1894 E Johnson St. This property is owned by the WisDOT and Canadian Pacific. The current main has a segment that is back pitched and limited available capacity. The project at 1601-1917 Sherman Ave. has increased the demand on our sanitary system and our project end date is to coordinate with the occupancy of that private development project. The estimated cost of the project is \$901,000.

Madison Parks anticipates replacing the playgrounds at Kennedy Park (5202 Retana Dr.), Ontario Park (720 Ontario St.), Sanburg Park (2818 Independence Ln.) and Skyview Park (1418 E. Skyline Dr.) in early 2026. These playgrounds have all been evaluated by the City of Madison's Playground Construction Inspector and it has been determined that these playgrounds have reached the end of their maintainable operating lifespan. Madison Parks has a responsibility to the public to provide playgrounds that are safe and adhering to national standards. By replacing these amenities Parks, will continue to meet these expectations. The project work involves completely removing and replacing each existing playground and play surfacing. The current estimated cost is \$300,000.
