The developer, Threshold Development Group, LLC, has been conditionally approved for the demolition of a vacant place of worship and the construction of a three-story multi-family residential building with structured lower-level parking at 252 Dunning Street. This water pipeline rehabilitation project will use a lining technology known as structural cured-in-place pipe (CIPP), a process where a woven fabric tube is saturated with a liquid epoxy resin, pulled through the inside of the deteriorated pipe, and then inflated and cured with hot water or steam to form a new plastic pipe inside the old pipe. The rehabilitated pipes have full structural strength (more than simply a coating or lining inside the old pipe) and are expected to last at least 50 years before additional maintenance needs to be considered. This will be Madison Water Utility's eleventh year doing water main rehabilitation contracts in this manner. We have been working with the DNR through these years to develop, evaluate and refine successful specifications for this technology. The estimate project cost is \$175,000.

Metro Transit's Transit Network Redesign will restructure Madison's bus routes and schedules. The plan was adopted in 2022 and will be implemented on June 11, 2023. The work for approval is needed street infrastructure improvements to operate the routes. It consists of four projects: a minor change to the island at Highland and Regent for Route E, a new bus stop platform at Mineral Point and Gammon that is too large for city crews, about 200 feet of sidewalk and platform on the west side of Westfield Road north of Mineral Point Road, and a new sidewalk bumpout and bus stop eastbound on Badger Road at Rusk Avenue. The estimate project cost is \$110,000.

The city-owned fiber optic cable infrastructure along Mineral Point Road has age degradation and the demand for fiber optic cable will surpass the availability to support city services. The plan is to upgrade the existing infrastructure and install new infrastructure on the north terrace of Mineral Point to allow for the fiber optic network to be migrated out of the median where it is currently in conflict with the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. This work will support BRT, keep existing network sites (including Public Safety, Traffic Engineering and Water Utility) connected with minimal interruptions, and set the city up for future needs. The estimate project cost is \$800,000.
