The Task Force on Farmland Preservation is meeting twice a month on the second and fourth Wednesdays at 3pm. In January we created a list of topics and questions to be addressed by the Task Force, and formed three teams to work on specific areas: Land Access, Land Characteristics and Policy Review. All of our working materials are listed under the "Resources" section of our meeting agendas. For the next two months the teams will work in between Task Force meetings to assemble the information and research so that everything needed for the final report will be done by the end of March.

We will be having a presentation on the updated Sustainability Plan at our February 22 meeting. Alder Evers is working on a resolution to extend the deadline of the Task Force through June to enable us to write the report and have it circulated through committees for feedback before final approval by the Common Council.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) emergency allotments will be coming to an end in February. All SNAP (FoodShare in Wisconsin) recipients have been receiving additional funds on their EBT card since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, with everyone receiving at least the maximum benefit for their household size and the households with the least resources receiving an additional \$95/month. Beginning in March, households will return to their pre-pandemic benefit levels, which could be a change of hundreds of dollars per month for some families. Emergency food providers are bracing for a potential surge in demand.

Part of the group's homework was watching this video of presentations on networking by the Mississippi Food Justice Collaborative, Vermont Farm to Plate Network, Northwest Atlantic Marine Alliance & Fish Local Collaborative, and the HEAL Food Alliance. The Mississippi conversation is particularly rich and highly recommend re: watching and thinking about what the participants have to say.
