A motion was made by Wilcox, seconded by Sparer, to amend Resolution 11977 as per the attached sheet with changes indicated (file uploaded as an attachment in Legistar File 11977 - Approved Amended Language for File 11977\_Housing Committee.pdf). The motion passed by voice vote/other with Chair Hirsch abstaining.

Wilcox changed some of the language regarding low-income housing to affordable housing. She also changed the language regarding "pockets of poverty" to "concentration of low income households" which is something we would like to avoid if possible. She changed moving toward an expanded regional housing service by combining the housing operations. There should be 13 members including the names of 6 recommendations from the County Executive and members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Common Council, and that 2 members shall be designated as co-chairs.
