ADDENDUM

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS:

40. 15472

Approving plans and specifications and authorizing the Board of Public Works to advertise and receive bids for South Madison Branch Library Interior Building Improvements, Contract No. 6348. (14th AD)

Estimated cost of this work is \$1,200,000.00. This project consists of the interior "build-out" of the South Madison Branch Library and includes general construction, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC. Area of work is approximately 12,000 square feet. Report by City Engineering.

MISCELLANEOUS

41. <u>15477</u>

Authorizing the City Comptroller to execute an amendment to PO Number 97235274 for masonry repairs to the hose tower at Fire Station No. 10.

The original intent of the purchase order was to provide labor and materials to tear down the four foot high, severely damaged parapet wall on in the hose tower and rebuild it to a lower height of 16 inches. Brick was to be salvaged and reused since the original brick could no longer be obtained. The next lowest four feet was to be inspected and repaired with remaining original brick as part of this scope of work. The amount of the purchase order was \$22,700.00

Upon repairing this additional lower four feet, it was found that this brick contained numerous stress crack that ran parallel to the face of the brick. In some cases, this allowed the brick face to be pried away with slight leverage. This was apparently caused by moisture that had come through the failed parapet cap. The moisture appears to have gone down to a level of about 14 feet from this original parapet cap. This brick appears from a distance to be in good shape, but upon digging out the mortar of adjacent damaged bricks, stress cracks were reveled on what appeared to be sound bricks.

It was determined that there would not be enough salvaged brick to make the repairs, thus matching bricks samples were found that best approximated the existing brick color. Blending in these bricks would be noticeable. Therefore, it was decided to install a limestone band below the damaged area at the elevation of the window ledge. This elevation is about 14 feet below the original parapet cap and corresponds to the level of the stone parapet cap of the next lowest/adjacent roofline. Therefore, this remaining original brick would be free of any moisture damage. New brick would be installed above this band and proceed up to the new parapet capstone. This band and capstone would have the same dimensions and reveal at the existing stone on the building. The additional cost to make the repairs total \$9,135 for brick//limestone and \$23,440 for construction.
