- #3 in the first "Now Therefore Be It Resolved" clause shall read:
- "3. Reducing residential per capita water use by 25% compared to current City-wide per capita levels through the use of low-flow appliances and fixtures, dual-flow and low-flow toilets, rain barrels, low-impact lawn care design, conservation education and outreach, or other water conservation practices, <u>and to strongly encourage the use of EPA Water Sense-labeled water fixtures, and strongly discouraging the use of outdoor lawn irrigation systems.</u>"
