Attorney David Sparer, representing Madison Community Co-op, appeared in support of this ordinance. The current ordinance allows non-profit 501C3 entities to exist in many of the zoning districts that are more single-family oriented. A few years back, that rule was modified to allow non-profits and co-ops to exist in a broader range of zoning districts but the definition wasn't as clear as it could be. This is a clarification amendment. This has to do with the definition of "family". A family can buy a house and occupy it. A non-owner occupied use of the same house is restricted. There is an exception that if non-profit housing providers own the house, they can be considered the same as a family. If the dwelling unit is operated like a boarding house, then they do not clearly fall into that exception. The ordinance amendment includes boarding houses which are operated by non-profit cooperatives. The way the definition exists now it would not allow the non-profit cooperatives to get the benefit of the ordinance. The cooperative would still have to apply for conditional use and get the Plan Commission approval.

Brink noted this would take properties off the tax roll and this is a huge loop hole that would be unbelievable in different neighborhoods. He is against this proposal as it is not a conditional use now and it would take the property off the tax roll. It should be taken in a different zoning area or take it through a PUD where it would have to go through Plan Commission. Sparer noted this would be tax exempt for income tax purposes for IRS and not for property tax. In this case, Madison Community Co-op is real estate tax exempt but not all co-ops are.

Merrill moved to refer this to the Landlord & Tenant Issues Subcommittee and the Affordable Housing Subcommittee, second by Brink. Kerr would like to have some input from the Zoning staff at the subcommittee meetings. This was on a vote of 8-1 (King). Sparer did not participate in the vote.

David Sparer, representing Madison Community Coop, appeared in support of the ordinance. He handed out the definition of family as it is currently contained in the Zoning Code. The proposal does not change the current code but it changes what is permitted in the Zoning Code. Madison Community Coop owns 13 buildings and each is operated as a large house in which a number of people live together, share cooking facilities, bathrooms and common areas. The Zoning Code limits the number of people who can reside on a property. The situation that comes up for Madison Community Coop is that they have in the past owned some of the really large coops on campus and they have run them as lodging houses. Lodging houses are required to have locks on bedroom doors. The problem that comes up is that most of the their housing is in the downtown/campus area and those districts permit lodging houses, however when you get into other districts that are the subject of the proposed amendment, currently it is not a permitted use. If the house were looked at as one dwelling unit, then the ordinance as it currently exists would permit them to be there. These dwelling units are not looked at that way and because they have locks on the bedroom doors, they can not be properly called a single unit. This would be a lodging house and each bedroom would be a unit. This proposal would add lodging housing. This would make it a conditional use to go through the Plan Commission with neighborhood notice.

Ald. Judy Olson appeared in support of the proposed ordinance. There is a coop in her district that is limited to 5 members. They could more fully occupy the building if this limitation didn't restrict them. Madison Community Coop would also like to occupy some housing in other neighborhoods. This would make it more affordable for them. As far as tax exempt, this shouldn't be mixed up with this. This won't permit more tax exempt properties, it is not the goal.

Brink is concerned that this would allow coops going into every neighborhood without considerable consideration. Olson noted that alderpersons are notified on conditional use applications and neighbors are also notified.

Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Approval to the PLAN COMMISSION

David Sparer appeared in the capacity of attorney for the Madison Community Cooperative, seeking a change in the current zoning ordinance to permit the conditional use of lodging houses in R3, R4, R4L and R4A districts. Sparer described the intent of the ordinance change is to permit housing cooperatives entities qualifying as tax-exempt lodging houses the potential to offer a form of affordable housing in an expanded number of zoning districts. The subcommittee raised issues regarding the potential for abuse of this expansion, particularly near the university neighborhood where overcrowding of individuals is already an issue. Sparer noted that the ordinance is narrowly defined to include only tax-exempt organizations, and that the entity would need to pass the review of the Plan Commission in order to obtain a conditional use.

The Subcommittee noted that Planning Unit staff were preparing a report on the potential impact of the ordinance change that would be presented to the Plan Commission.

Mr. Mikolajewski described the previous work completed by the EDC, Council, and City staff on the 2010 Economic Development Division Work Plan. Mr. Mikolajewski noted that this Work Plan was formally submitted to the Council on September 15th. It is now before the EDC for action.

Mr. Mikolajewski reminded the EDC that the Work Plan is for the entire Economic Development Division, which includes three offices: Office of Economic Revitalization, Office of Business Resources, and Office of Real Estate Services. At the request of Alder Clear, Mr. Mikolajewski provided additional information regarding the functions of the Office of Economic Revitalization.

#### Discussion:

Ms. Selkowe made two recommendations for amending the Work Plan. First, Ms. Selkowe noted that although Recommendation # 2 recognizes the need for quality job creation, the document does not define what constitutes a quality job. Ms. Selkowe believes it should.

Second, Ms. Selkowe suggested that the job creation, physical development linkage noted on Page 9 could easily be incorporated into Recommendation # 3.

Ms. Torkildson questioned how the jobs could be tracked, especially given that no funds have been allocated for this purpose. Mr. Nelson echoed this concern.

As a follow-up to Ms. Selkowe's question about defining "quality jobs," Mr. Mikolajewski noted that the accepted 3-5 Year Strategic Economic Development Implementation Plan provides a definition of quality jobs. Mr. Mikolajewski read the definition, which states that quality jobs are those that "pay at least a living wage, have competitive benefits, and have promotional and human growth opportunities."

Mr. Slone questioned how OBR would only focus on quality jobs?

Mr. Mikolajewski indicated that subconsciously, OBR staff already places a priority on those prospects that will create quality jobs; however, he agreed that it is something that should be written into the Work Plan.

Mr. Slone asked for some clarification regarding the title of Recommendation # 2 and Mr. Mikolajewski furnished a reply.

Ms. Torkildson questioned how we track job creation today, and how we could in the future?

Mr. Mikolajewski indicated that it depends on the degree of interaction that the City has with a business. City staff sometimes is asked to simply provide some direction regarding available assistance or space. In this case, the City really doesn't have a lot of information about the business. In other cases; however, where the City is providing financial assistance through TIF for the Capital Revolving Fund, the City would likely have information about the types of jobs being retained/created.

Mr. Mikolajewski continued that there are software packages available that can also help the City calculate the jobs to be created/retained through various industry sectors. The Workforce Development Board of South Central Wisconsin uses one of these programs; however, it is something that the City may consider purchasing.

Ms. Selkowe suggested adding broad language within Recommendation # 2 and # 3 to direct staff to identify quality jobs.

Ms. Stone expressed some concern about devoting too much time to tracking.

Mr. Mikolajewski noted that there are currently not requirement for applicants seeking City permits to furnish information about the types of jobs that will be generated within their proposed projects, and Mr. Mikolajewski advised against such a requirement. It is,however, often requested when applicants are seeking TIF or Capital Revolving Fund assistance. Mr. Mikolajewski noted the challenge of tracking now due to limited staff availability.

Mr. Slone recommended the following language: "City staff will encourage through available means development and tracking of quality jobs."

Alder Clear noted that contractors are already comfortable with providing some of this information because of some of the requirements for working with the City.

Ms. Stone asked about the definition of a living wage?

Mr. Mikolajewski noted that this is set by the City, and changes over time.

Ms. Selkowe requests that a one- or two-sentence explanation of each of the City's programs be included for all of the tools found in Recommendation # 4.

Alder Clear asked whether items not included within next year's plan (those found on p. 8 and later in the document) would be included or dropped from this document?

Mr. Mikolajewski recommended keeping them in the document in case additional resources become available, and so that they are memorialized for consideration in future work plans.

Mr. Nelson requested Mr. Mikolajewski to review the suggested changes that had been made during the discussion. They include:

- 1. Add the definition of "quality jobs" noted above to the narrative of Recommendation # 2 and # 3.
- 2. Move the statement regarding job creation physical development connection found on Page 9 to the narrative of Recommendation # 3.
- 3. Add Mr. Slone's proposed language regarding the tracking of quality jobs to the narrative of Recommendation # 2 and # 3.
- 4. Add a brief description statement for each economic development tool outlined in Recommendation # 4.

Mr. Nelson asked if there were any objections to considering these changes a friendly amendment to the motion made earlier by Mr. Slone and seconded by Alder Clear. There were no objections to considering these suggestions friendly.
