6.	<u>18918</u>	Authorizing the Mayor, City Clerk and Chief of Police to accept an award from the State of Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance in the amount of up to \$7,900 and to utilize these funds to purchase Wisconsin Interoperable System for Communications (WISCOM) radios to allow for interoperability between the Madison Police command center and law enforcement and emergency agencies.
7.	<u>19027</u>	Authorizing the Mayor and the Chief of Police to accept donated funds, services and supplies for the creation of the Madison Police Memorial Garden.
8.	<u>18984</u>	Amending the 2010 Transit Utility Operating Budget to delete a 1.0 FTE Transit Finance Supervisor position, Compensation Group 44, Range 09, and creation of a .5 FTE Information Systems Specialist 2 position, Compensation Group 44, Range 08, to be combined with a current .5 Information Systems Specialist 2 position with the incumbent to create a 1.0 FTE Information Systems Specialist 2 position.
9.	<u>18947</u>	Authorizing the Transit General Manager to file an application for a Section 5307, public transit capital, capital maintenance and capital planning grant with U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute the associated grant agreement with USDOT and the associated 13(c) agreement with Teamsters Local No. 695.
10.	<u>18917</u>	Accept \$172,678 in Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds from the WI Department of Commerce and authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute agreements with specific non-profit agencies providing housing and services for homeless persons.
11.	18929	Authorizing the provision of \$432,000 in Federal HOME Match funds to assist Common Wealth Development, Inc. in acquiring and rehabilitating two 4-unit buildings for the purpose of providing affordable rental housing.
