The Plan Commission held a discussion of the Commercial/ Mixed-Use District sections, Employment District sections and Special District sections of the draft Zoning Code.

- Staff explained the purpose of the new yellow copy of the zoning code. It was decided that the Plan Commissioners will work off the white copy at the September 23rd working session
- Discussion about the zoning code introduction process.

Employment Districts

- Incorporate into the Traditional Workplace and Employment Center districts entrance orientation standards like on page 39 in the mixed use districts?
- Change the "Traditional Workplace" district to "Traditional Employment" district?
- What is a "call center"? It is a telecommunication center. Need a definition for telecommunication center. Should they be allowed in the commercial districts?
- Why not zoning everything Suburban Employment (SE) district rather than Suburban Employment Center (SEC) district? Why perpetuate SEC district development patterns? Height is the only difference between the SEC district and the SE district. The SEC district allows higher bldg the SE district.
- Parking location requirements are also SE SEC district issues.
- How can we foster transitions from SEC areas to SE areas?
- Why maximum floor area ration of 1.0 in the SEC district?
- Allow higher buildings in the Traditional Workplace and SE district?
- What are the primary differences between the Industrial-Limited and Industrial-General districts?

Staff initiated discussion by referencing the agenda packet's inclusion of previously summarized comments on the Zoning Code Rewrite from the Urban Design Commission's special meetings of May 27, October 28, and December 7, 2009, along with special meeting minutes of January 27, 2010, as well as comments forwarded by individual Commissioners (Harrington forwarded prior to the meeting of January 27, 2010 including comments from Slayton and Smith in response to issues discussed and requiring further attention at that same meeting). Staff noted that this information should be utilized as the basis for making an Urban Design Commission recommendation on the draft ordinance provisions.

COMMISSION

Tucker reported on the joint meeting between the Plan Commission and the Urban Design Commission held on February 15, 2010; where a discussion on the UDC's role was discussed with an emphasis on the waiver process within the draft provisions relative to Commercial Mixed-Use And Commercial District Sections and Building Form Standards; UDC and PC versus just one body.

Discussion on Section 28.141(8)(a), <u>Surfacing</u> relative to permeable pavement provisions should be encouraged where permitted; regardless of the number of stalls.

Relative to Section 28.142(5)(b) references to the use of "weed barriers" should be eliminated; bad for the environment and underlying soils and be replaced with provisions for vegetative cover and organic mulches.

On a motion by Slayton, seconded by Rummel the Urban Design Commission recommended adoption and confirming amendments to the Madison General Ordinances as set forth in attached Exhibit F pursuant to Sec. 66.0103, Wis. Stats. to revise the City's Zoning Ordinance with all comments by the Urban Design Commission to be incorporated into a recommendation to the Plan Commission from the Commission's prior review of the draft provisions at its meetings of May 27, October 28, December 7, 2009 and January 27, 2010, including comments of record from the meeting of February 24, 2010 along with individual comments by Harrington, Slayton and Smith (forwarded prior to and following discussion at the January 27, 2010 meeting). Staff and the Zoning Code Rewrite Staff Team is to summarize and condense the collective recommendations prior to consideration by the Plan Commission of the draft ordinance provisions with the Urban Design Commission to be copied on the condensed recommendations with a report to the Urban Design Commission on the Plan Commission's action on its recommendations. The motion was passed on a vote of (5-0).

The Plan Commission recommended approval of the proposed planned unit development subject to the comments and conditions in the Plan Commission materials and the following conditions:

- That the final plans, zoning text and lease include a condition prohibiting bicycle and moped parking between the front wall of the building and front property line except in the designated spaces shown on the approved plans;
- That in granting final approval of the planned unit development, the Urban Design Commission give careful consideration to the final backyard landscaping plan, and the design of the stair and elevator protrusion along the front facade of the fourth floor;
- That any changes to the floorplans related to design changes to the stair and elevator protrusion on the fourth floor that causes an increase or decrease in the number of dwelling units or bedrooms in the project be approved administratively without coming back to the Plan Commission.
- An amendment moved by Olson, seconded by Ald. Kerr requesting that the Urban Design Commission also carefully consider expanding the use of brick on the building exterior was added to the main motion by the following vote: AYE- Ald. Cnare, Gruber, Basford, Olson; NAY- Ald. Kerr, Andrzejewski, Heifetz; NON-VOTING: Fey; EXCUSED: Ald. Schumacher, Sundquist.

In recommending approval of the development, the Plan Commission stated that this project did not represent a precedent which could be used to justify other future developments in the W. Mifflin Street area. The Commission also requested that similar language regarding this project not being a precedent also be included in the forthcoming draft Downtown Plan.

Dan Rolfs presented the Request for Proposals documents and described the planning process and schedule. He explained that the James Madison Park Surplus Committee declared the buildings at James Madison Park to be surplus and the ground underneath the buildings to remain City property. The Real Estate Staff developed the RFPs and would like to get comments from City Commissions and Committee bodies. Mr. Rolfs explained that the buildings would be sold and the land would be leased on a 99 year lease. The buildings would have front yards, side yards and minimal rear yards for use by the building owner.

There was general discussion about the proposed schedule and general issues.

Alder Maniaci explained that the neighborhood would like to see private ownership for the buildings at 640 and 646 and a public use for the Collins House, but the proposals will be scored competitively. Alder Maniaci also explained that the scoring for the Collins House does not inlude points for keeping the building in its current location because it was never discussed to move it. The relocation of the buildings at 640 and 646 were previously discussed. Mr. Rolfs explained that relocation has a significant financial impact on the proposal scoring and a proposal that does not propose relocation will be favored.

Rick Bernstein, 601 South Dickinson, registered in neither support or opposition. Mr. Bernstein explained that there are state laws that apply to the sale of these properties since they are in the Fourth Lake Ridge National Register Historic District. He suggested that sections 66.111 and 700.40 of the Wisconsin Historic Preservation Statutes be referenced in the RFP. He also suggested that tax credit incentives be referenced in the RFP.

Jason Tish, Lafollette Avenue, registered in neither support or opposition. Mr. Tish reviewed the prepared comments from the Madison Trust for Historic Preservation and stated that the Trust is concerned about the relocation of 640 and 646 because significant exterior alteration is inevitable when relocation occurs.

Mr. Stephans stated that a financially responsible proposal is in the best interest of the properties and their future care and maintenance.
