The racks shall be securely anchored to the ground or building to prevent the lockers or racks from being removed from the location. A bike-parking stall is 2 feet by 6 feet, with a 6-foot vertical clearance and a 5-foot access aisle. The applicant shall work with Planning and Zoning staff on how the remaining 39 bicycle parking stalls will be provided."
