# RESOLUTIONS APPROVING THE CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

15. 24862 Approving plans and specifications and authorizing the Board of Public Works to advertise and receive bids for Tenney Park Shelter Parking Lot Reconstruction, Contract No. 6811.

The Parks Division is in the middle of a 2 phase reconstruction project at Tenney Park. It includes the reconstruction of the existing shelter and adjacent parking lot. The first phase was the reconstruction of the shelter and the surrounding site work – which was completed this fall. Phase 2 will include the reconfiguration/reconstruction of the shelter parking lot. The new parking lot will have the same number of parking stalls but, because the new layout is more efficient, the overall amount of asphalt will be less. The parking lot reconstruction will be accomplished by grinding the existing surface and re-distributing it as base course for the new layout, while also adding more base course (raising the lot), to assure a longer lasting asphalt surface on top of these poor soils. The stormwater from the site currently is conveyed by surface drainage to the lagoon that wraps around the site. The new parking lot will be graded so that all storm water will run to a rain garden constructed adjacent to the parking lot. Overall cost of the project is \$150,000. The project is expected to start as soon as possible in the spring and completed by May 25th, 2012.

The project includes, but is not specifically limited to:

- 2. Installing a concrete frost-protected shallow foundation for the meter enclosure.
- 3. Providing the required materials and labor for building the meter enclosure.
- 4. Installing all necessary electrical connections to the meter enclosure, including the subpanel and heating unit.
- 5. Additional site work including:
  - a. Removing/replacing the existing chain link fence as needed.
  - b. Site and landscaping restoration.
- 6. All other work required to complete the project as described within the plans and specifications.

Estimated cost of this project is \$45,000.

The Common Council adopted a plan in 1996 to repair defective sidewalk throughout the City on a ten-year cycle. The plan was updated in 2002 and 2012 to reflect the completed work and to incorporate the reconstituted aldermanic districts. The 5th Aldermanic District has been scheduled for repair in 2012. Offset, settled or badly cracked sidewalk sections are replaced with this program, the City and the abutting

property owner each paying one half of the cost. The program is also used to install curb ramps at intersections. Curb ramps are funded solely by the City.
