15. 31041 Reapproving Plans and Specifications for Unit Well 26 Generator Addition, Project Number 53W1633 (9th AD)

On April 17th the Board approved plans and specifications for the original scope of the Unit Well 26 Generator Addition project. The original scope included the purchase and installation of an emergency standby generator and the construction of an addition to the existing pump house building to house the generator. The project also included an upgrade of the Motor Control Center and other miscellaneous improvements.

As design was being finalized, the project consultant provided a Estimate of Probable Construction Cost that was significantly higher than the project budget. In light of the higher probable cost, Madison Water chose to reduce the scope of the project to bring it back in line with the original budget. The new project scope eliminates the building addition. The plan is to locate the generator outside as a free-standing unit. It will be housed inside a pre-fabricated, noise-attenuating enclosure. Madison Water has approximately nine similar units at other wells. When viewed from High Point Road it will be located behind (west) of the existing elevated tank. The unit will be fenced and screened with landscaping. The upgrade to the Motor Control Center and other smaller improvements remain in the scope. The original project objective of improving west side water supply reliability remains and will be met with the revised project scope.

Estimated cost of this project is \$450,000.

Approving plans and specifications and authorizing the Board of Public Works to advertise and receive bids for Traffic Engineering Electrical Upgrades - 2013.

This project is for the upgrade of the existing 60-year old electrical system at the TE Operations Center at 1120 Sayle Street. Estimated cost of this project is \$150,000.00

The Reiner Road Right of way currently is split between the Town of Burke and the City of Madison. The street will be resurfaced with three inches of asphalt pavement under City Contract. The Town of Burke and the City of Madison will each be responsible for the cost to resurface their share of Reiner Road.

Total estimated cost of this project is \$150,000 (\$75,000 from the City of Madison and \$75,000 from the Town of Burke)
