13.	<u>42702</u>	Authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a forgivable loan agreement with the Allied Community Cooperative for \$53,667 in pre-development funds from the Healthy Retail Access Program for the purposes of advancing the Allied Community Cooperative Market project in the Allied Drive/Dunn's Marsh neighborhoods.
14.	<u>42696</u>	Approving the provision of up to \$158,700 in 2016 Emerging Opportunities Program (EOP) funds to agencies and authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to enter into agreements with those agencies to implement the designated projects.
15.	<u>42710</u>	Amending the City's adopted 2016 Capital Budget to increase by \$60,000 the Economic Development Division's Funding Sources ("Transfer From TIF District"), Expenditures ("Other"), and allocation for Project #13 ("TID 43 Park/Drake") to provide additional funding for the Greenbush Neighborhood Small Cap TIF, supporting the conversion of deteriorating rental housing into renovated owner occupied housing.
