This project will remove and replace the existing concrete boat launch at the Olin Turville Park. Estimated cost of this project is \$300,000.

A dedicated project team of Madison Water Utility (MWU) staff and their consultant, SEH

Inc., have developed a project design to upgrade Well 12 and convert it to a two zone facility. This planned upgrade was identified in the MWU Master Plan and to improve operational flexibility. The project will also correct a long standing deficiency, identified by the DNR, of the need for separate chemical feed rooms at the facility.

The project is critical to the overall water supply system on the west side. It will allow for water to be pumped from Zone 7 to Zone 8, adding redundancy and reliability to the system. The proposed facility would also allow water to flow from Zone 8 down to Zone 7 if needed. This operational flexibility would delay the need for new wells and save those associated costs; the ability to optimize the use of existing wells is a big advantage to the overall water supply system.

The project will include upgraded water pumps and electrical equipment, and provide separate rooms for chemical feed equipment and a rest room. The work is scheduled to start in the beginning of spring of 2018, and be completed by the end of spring 2019. Pipeline work associated with the project was completed in the spring of 2017.

Original bids in 2015, for a partial upgrade of the facility, were ultimately rejected due to unreasonable costs. MWU elected at that time to pursue a full facility demolition/reconstruction as a more cost effective project alternative.

Estimated cost of this project is \$2.8 million.
