The establishment shall not sell, dispense or give away flavored fortified wines in the original container with an alcohol content of more than 12.5% alcohol by volume, where spirits have been added to the wine that have not been produced from the same fruit as the wine, for consumption off the licensed premises. This prohibition shall not apply to any other wine product as defined by Wisconsin State Statute §125.02(22).
