Lead agency is Board of Public Works with additional referral of Pedestrian/Bicycle/Motor Vehicle Commission. Ped/Bike recommended approval with the following considerations for inclusion in the final design:

1. Remove parking along machinery row. Replace with combination of a bike lane, maybe 12 ft sidewalk instead of a 9ft, to enable the opportunity for table/cafe space, and additional green space.

- 2. Include table top crosswalk of Blount Street crossing on south side (so bikes & peds heading toward Jenifer Street stay up at sidewalk level.
- 3. Swing path away/around pinch point in front of Fauerbach and regrade/add retaining wall as necessary.
- 4. Keep the channelized right turn, and table top the ped crosswalk in the design; look at timing between the green light preference vs the right turn green to prioritize bike/ped crossing.
- 5. Include Ped/Bike button on E Wilson East Bound Left Turn in median, if not a button, perhaps in-ground sensor or other technology.
- 6. Bike path through parking lot is not ideal, continue to work on this in the Parks Master Plan, keeping growth focus on pedestrian and biking transportation.

The Portage Road/Eastpark Path project consists of construction of approximately 1,950 feet of multi-use path adjacent to Portage Road and Hayes Road at 4603 Di Loreto Avenue in the City of Madison. The path will begin at the northeast corner of the Portage Road and Hayes Road intersection and extend east and then north to Di Loreto Avenue. A connection to the path from Hayes Road will also be provided through a City owned storm water management parcel located at 4662 Hayes Road. A proposed bridge will be

located partially on the City parcel at 4662 Hayes Road and will span across the existing storm water channel along the north side of the parcel. The project is being completed in conjunction with an ongoing Development project located at 4103 - 4119 Portage Road.

The Eastlawn Plat Bike/Ped Bridge portion of the project consists of installing a new bridge on existing abutments that where constructed in 2010 in the initial phase of construction of the Plat. The proposed bridge will span across a City owned stormwater management parcel within the plat. Ongoing development of the Plat now requires that the bridge be installed in order for the Developer to complete construction of the path and construct future phases of the Plat.

Estimated cost of this project is \$900,000
