The Gardens Network is holding its annual summit event, with workshops and good food, on Saturday, February 16 from 9-3 at Badger Rock Community Center. Sheboygan Garden at Rennebohm Park leaders are expected to make a presentation to the MFPC in early 2019.

15 <u>54596</u> Integrated Pest Management Policy Review Task Force February 2019

The Task Force met twice last month. On January 7, staff made presentations about how Public Health, Water Utility, Engineering and Parks implement the current IPM policy. Follow-up questions were invited, and responses sought, before the next meeting. On January 28th., Lisa Laschinger provided extensive responses to questions asked of Parks, and comments from members of the public were addressed. Staff also summarized key findings from the Survey of Current Practices sent to all departments known to be using pesticides; over 40 responses were received.

At its next meeting, on February 18, the Task Force will focus on potential recommendations for a new/revised IPM policy. If necessary, an additional meeting may be held on March 11th.

Two new school food Pantries opened in January, 2019 in partnership with Selfless Ambition. Service is now available at Leopold and Lake View Elementary Schools. They are looking to grow this service into additional school sites for the 2019-20 school year. We received over \$29,000 in Donations over the holidays to assist students with negative meal account balances. We received large donations from a fundraising campaign started by MMSD Human Resources as well as another Donation from Isthmus Engineering and Manufacturing. Several citizens also sent in individual contributions. These funds were used to help 1,697 students with negative meal account balances.
