

Target Population

City of Madison residents whose **legal status generally limits their access to public benefits**. This includes undocumented immigrants and refugees with a variety of statuses such as:

- People without lawful permanent residence
- People who do not have legal status as defined by U.S. customs
- DACA recipients
- Asylum seekers

Scope of Services

- Direct financial assistance/cash transfers
- Support for:
 - Legal assistance
 - Transportation
 - Unemployment benefits
 - Utility bills
 - Job training assistance/workplace safety
 - Internet access
 - Language learning
 - Food insecurity/meal programming
- Navigating the Health Care System
- Other needs identified by the resident/households


