





Q4 Based on neighborhood feedback, the City is evaluating options to construct raingardens at three potential locations within road right-of way as part of the Lake Mendota Drive Reconstruction. These raingardens would be constructed as part of the City's Terrace Raingarden Program. The City of Madison's Terrace Raingarden Program will provide for the initial construction and planting of the raingardens, but after planting, the maintenance would be turned over to neighborhood volunteers either through the Adopt-a-Median Program or a separate agreement if the raingarden is outside of a traffic median. Evaluating these options is still in progress and will be determined as part of the final design of the corresponding projects, if there is interest from the neighborhood.



Lake Mendota Drive Reconstruction 2022-2024 Survey No. 2





Q6 The preliminary plan includes a number of traffic calming features, listed below. Are you supportive of these proposed traffic calming elements? Check all that you would be supportive of.




