

Survey Summary: Open-Ended Reponses Themes

The list below is a summary of the main reoccurring themes heard while examining the survey responses to the question below. This list is roughly in order of the number of occurrences.

## "Is there anything specific that you like or dislike about the Draft Network Plan? Anything else you'd like Metro Transit to know"

- 1. Wants a coverage model, not a ridership model. This model results in less access, increased walking distances (problem in winter weather), and major inequities for low-income and disabled populations.
- 2. The removal of Route 15 coverage is a major concern, particularly the west end of the route (Old Sauk Rd./ Tree/ High Point). West siders need that direct connection to UW/Downtown. Also lot of concern using Westfield over High Point Rd.
- 3. The removal of service to the Pick'n Save on the north side (current Route 17 service). Concern about how people will access affordable food options.
- 4. Lack of access to the St. Vinny's food pantry and pharmacy on Fish Hatchery Rd.
- 5. More service is needed on the south side that is currently served by Route 13 (Olin, Bay Creek, Brams, Cap View, Burr Oaks, Alliant Energy).
- 6. More service is needed where Route 19 used to cover, particularly to the neighborhoods off of Allied Dr. and Nakoma Rd.
- 7. Service is needed on the far-east side. No service south of Cottage Grove Rd., east of Buckeye. People that are transit dependent live in those neighborhoods and would have no service.
- 8. Use of Ridge Rd. is problematic. Not pedestrian friendly, no sidewalks, narrow, very concerned citizens.
- 9. The north side in general is underserved concerns particularly about Troy/ School/ Aberg and the removal of service on Sherman (particularly Sherman Terrace residents). More coverage and frequency.
- 10. More service is needed in Middleton. Many believe this draft plan is a major cut to the current Middleton service. Both in frequency and coverage.
- 11. Likes the frequency upgrade and simplification of the system. Much needed, looking more like transit service in a bigger city.
- 12. Service from west side to UW Hospital is inadequate.
- 13. Service on the west side lacking in Westmorland/ Sunset Village (Odana Rd, Segoe, Midvale Heights, Tokay) to UW Campus. Zig/Zag service, needs to be direct.
- 14. Service lacking near Acewood Blvd on east side. More service between Milwaukee and Cottage Grove Rd. No service into any neighborhoods on east side.
- 15. Service lacking to/from LaFollette Highschool and OwlCreek/other east side neighborhoods where students primarily live
- 16. Dislike the loss of transfer points and park and rides.

- 17. Dislike the loss of Route 56/57 coverage on the far southwest side/ Maple Grove area.
- 18. Belief that this plan further prioritizes people who live on the isthmus
- 19. Feels like the access to healthcare and food pantries/grocery are diminishing.
- 20. Lack of service to neighborhoods near Moorland Rd.
- 21. Lack of service to area near Dane County Humane Society and far-east side.
- 22. Lack of service in Moorland Rd. neighborhood.
- 23. Keep buses off of State St. (and other complaints about the implementation of BRT in general)
