



- Required more transfers


Over time – different groups have different experiences





Onboard Survey 2015

Current transit system, African Americans transfer 3 times more frequently than white riders





On-time Performance

Transfers don't affect everyone equally


On-time performance causes some riders to miss their transfers





On-board Survey 2015


Current transit system, African Americans experience trips longer than 45 minutes almost 3 times more frequently than white riders

 Recover from COVID-19 in a way that reflects future needs


 Compliments BRT and brings some of those benefits to more neighborhoods





Amendment Updates

- New Amendment 4E South Madison
- Revised Amendment 10 Ridge Street
- New Amendment 16C Southdale
- New Amendments 18A and 18B East Madison

Summary

 Draft plan with staff recommended amendments increases Metro's budget by an estimated \$1.0 million over pre-COVID levels.

 Some of this increase may be funded by external sources – private contributions and new government partners.

Response to Comments

Equity

- Federal Title VI requirements
- Individual Impacts vs. Disproportionate Impacts
- Plan does *not* shift resources to core of the City from elsewhere

Outreach

- Outreach activities were voluminous
- Southdale outreach was late, but it has occurred and Fitchburg has voted
- Keep in mind those who benefit in this Citywide initiative

Delay

- Some have called to slow down the process, not clear what it would achieve
- Amendments requested by neighbors have been presented
- Delay would risk our ability to do a soft rollout and make adjustments

Plan Adoption and Implementation

 Plan with amendments adopted by Common Council with recommendation by TPPB.

 Title VI service equity analysis and adjustments identified, if any.

 Schedules and bus stop changes approved by Transportation Commission.
