What is the Crossing Guard Program?

Madison's Crossing Guard Program is an integral element in supporting active transportation to and from elementary school.

- The City's adult school crossing guards play an important role in the lives of children who walk or bicycle to school by helping children safely cross the street at key locations.
- The presence of trained adult crossing guards can lead to more parents feeling comfortable about their children walking or bicycling to school.
- Crossing guards also serve as a role model helping children develop the skills necessary to cross streets safely at all times.















Who are the Crossing Guard staff?

- Crossing Guard Supervisors
 - Alex Stewart West
 - Virginia Kravik East
- 52 Crossing Guard locations currently
 - Staffing includes 4 relief Crossing Guards to cover absences
 - Crossing Guards work 1 (or 2) locations for 2-4 hours per day
 - Hiring can be challenging with the split shift & all weather requirements

Crossing Guard History

1960s

- Developed City's school crossing protection policies
- Criteria accepted by Common Council

1975

- Common Council requested reevaluation
- Lengthy review minor changes made
- Recommendations based on:
 - Criteria detail
 - Degree of hazard
 - Provide comparison

2014

- Pedestrian Bicycle Motor Vehicle
 Commission requested review of criteria
- Reviewed criteria
 - Madison's criteria found to be one of the best in the country

2016

- Last amended criteria to:
 - Notify neighborhood
 - School Traffic Safety Committee for requests

2021

 Crossing Guard Program moved from Police Department to Traffic Engineer

Hazard Rating

- >30 points ≥25 elementary students
 - Mark as School Crossing
- >20 points ≥25 elementary students
 - Install Flashing Beacons
- >40 points ≥25 elementary students
 - Assign Crossing Guard
- <30 points <15 elementary students
 - Discontinue existing Crossing Guard location

2021 Crossing Guard Location Review

July 28, 2021 Transportation Commission

- A permanent Crossing Guard location was approved for Schewe at Shadow Ridge (Pope Farm Elementary)
- The Transportation Committee deferred decisions on adding or eliminating any other locations
- Staff were asked to do studies again when staff felt that more typical traffic patterns had returned
 - Student counts & gap studies were done in May/June 2022
 - Streetlight speed data for all of 2021 was reviewed for morning/afternoon speeds
















Equity Considerations

Who could be impacted by the issues related to these changes? Who would benefit?

- Families with no other method of transportation for elementary school students to get to school could be impacted by the addition or removal of a crossing guard.
- Students/families who currently use locations where crossing guards are currently assigned would benefit from these location being maintained.
- Students/families who want to walk but do not perceive it as a safe option would benefit from additions of new locations. This is especially important in areas where other methods of transportation are less available/affordable for families.

Greater Madison MPO - Environmental Justice Areas







- Recommend do One Year Trial if staffing allows & review again in 2023
 - Work with school to increase walking & biking
- Continue to review Raymond Rd for larger improvements

6. Segoe at Richland

- Recommend to not add Crossing Guard
- Recommend add pedestrian refuge island
 - Speed limit reduction already approved
- Recommend to review for larger improvements

7. Midvale at Nakoma/Hammersley

- Recommend to not add Crossing Guard
- Review attendance area demographics and restudy as appropriate

Staff Recommendations Continued

8. Schewe at Old Sauk Road

- Recommend no Crossing Guard at this time
 - Review in future as more housing is built
 - RRFB already approved & will be added in 2023
- 9. Schewe at River Birch
 - Recommend no Crossing Guard at this time
 - Review in future as more housing is built

- Continue to work with School Traffic Safety Committee on locations
- Undertake Safe Routes to School Planning
 - Recommendations on strategies for increasing walking/biking
 - Review of Hazardous Bus Areas for infrastructure improvements
 - In-depth school planning which would include Crossing Guard location recommendations
 - Resolution of Support for Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) application for SRTS Planning will be reviewed by TPPB
