# **Sport Court Contract 2022**:

The sport court contract is wrapping up for 2022. Above are pictures of the process. Using water and chalk the contractor identifies all of the low spots on the courts and then fills them in so the courts no longer hold water. Then, after a thorough cleaning, all the cracks are filled.

#### All Wheel Spot at Warner Park:

As you recall, last summer Madison Parks developed an MOU with Madison Skateboard Fund which allows volunteers to build and maintain a "wheel spot" on an abandoned piece of asphalt in Warner Park. The asphalt used to be a bleacher pad, but we long ago abandoned the softball field it served due to lack of use. The volunteers wrapped up the work this spring, our crews put the finishing touches on it. And the skating has begun.

### <u>Volunteer Dirt Pump Track at Brentwood</u>:

As you recall, a few months ago a volunteer group asked to build a dirt pump track at Brentwood Park. The project was approved by the BPC and staff developed a MOU with the group. On July 9<sup>th</sup> they began and finished the project. A crew of neighbors, a mini excavator and specially designed dirt (three dump truck loads) and the track was built in one day.




