322 E Washington Ave

- Has both a preservation file and WHS site file.
- Commercial building constructed in 1905, Designed by Claude and Starck in the Gothic Revival style.
- Addition in 1925 by Balch & Lippert on the SE side, and a significant remodel in the 1960s by Vogel Brothers







Staff finding: Historic value as a product of multiple notable Madison based architectural firms.
