

Planning and Development Update

Presentation to the Board of Park Commissioners
November 9, 2022



Work by Contractor Wolf Paving & Excavating Co, Inc was completed in October on the west set of courts at Rennebohm Park – which were demolished by Parks construction staff in late summer prior to work beginning on the contract. The new courts feature an accessible route of travel from the shelter path system, new fencing and gates and are striped for both tennis and pickleball play, but will remain as "blacktop" through May 2023 to allow the asphalt to cure and adequate mean daytime and overnight temperatures to return prior to adding the "sport court (green)" surfacing. The east set of courts (including the addition of lighting on that side) is planned for construction in 2024.




Haen Family Park Cricket Pitch

Artificial Turf was installed on the existing concrete pad. Coordinated timing with the Madison Womens Cricket League.



Goodman Pool

Goodman hosts the All-City Swim meet in 2023, and the Parks Division is working so the pool is in ship shape. Extra space is required to line up the competitors behind the starting blocks, so we laid concrete down earlier this fall.



Olbrich Softball Fields 1 and 2

The Parks Division removed existing infield materials, re-graded the subgrade to promote drainage and remove irregularities, and new infield material installed.

- Richmond Hill Park


Parks that will have standard playgrounds removed and replaced with nature play or a different play feature include:

- Nautilus Park
- Olbrich Park (the small playground on the lake shore)
- Vilas Park (the small playground west of the shoe playground)



Westmorland Tennis/Pickleball Courts

Earlier this summer, Parks crack sealed the tennis courts at Westmorland. These courts are very old and have been through several rounds of crack sealing. Knowing that the crack seal would not last for long, Parks is trying a new product at Westmorland. We purchased and installed a court tile system to overlay the pavement. It is our hope that with this new system in place we can squeeze another 10 years of life out of these courts. The tile is dual striped for both tennis and pickball.

Rock Solid, the trail contractor, has been working on Shred to School since Labor Day, and the trail is coming along. Be sure to ride the Cannonball Trail from the beltline to Post Road to see the trail. This section of trail is one-way north and loops back around to the Cannonball Trail connection to the bridge. The work should be completed by the end of November. Parks is working with Engineering to spread native seed to restore the trail edges.
