Consistently voted the #1 pizzeria by UW-Madison students, Ian's Pizza by the Slice was named in 2007 one of the top ten things to do before graduation by the University of Wisconsin Alumni Association. Since then, we've continued opening up Ian's Pizza shops all around the country. Ian's Pizza Frances St is currently projected to bring in \$1.8 million in sales for 2022. Our goal as a store is to continue to grow and serve the city of Madison!
