Dear Common Council Members,

My name is Eli Tsarovsky, and I am the President of the Campus Area Neighborhood Association (CANA). The Campus Area Neighborhood Association is a volunteer organization that fosters civic engagement, builds community power, and advocates for the people of the Campus Area in Madison, WI. I am writing to you on behalf of the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment Steering Committee, regarding agenda item 52 which calls for "A resolution authorizing a non-competitive service contract with Eppstein Uhen Architects, LLC for professional architecture and engineering design consulting services for the State Street Campus Garage redevelopment project at 415 N. Lake Street."

I urge City Leaders to work with Eppstein Uhen Architects, LLC (EUA) to fulfill the mission of the City of Madison outlined under the City Budget program that describes "effective community engagement [as] a fundamental part of good governance, and continued resident participation only improves our neighborhoods, communities, and city." The design process for the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment Project ought to continue as described under the Mayor's Office budgetary program. There is great value in EUA, LLC to engaging with the Campus Area Neighborhood Association in their design process similar to how we engaged with the Mortenson Group through our Steering Committee process.

The Campus Area Neighborhood Association is concerned about how we have been systematically left out of the input process by City Leaders on the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment Process. Unfortunately, up to this point, the process for the project has failed this mission, undermining and dismissing the input on the public portion of the development. Since August, the Campus Area Neighborhood Association voluntarily set up a steering committee to collaboratively improve the project by providing solution-based feedback to City staff and the Mortenson group. This is the common practice that the Campus Area

Neighborhood is experienced in and has completed for the past major developments in our neighborhood.

City Staff engagement with our neighborhood has been subpar and far from the principles adopted by Council in Vision Zero and the Complete Green Streets plans. These documents compel staff to treat neighbors as experts of their community and respected as such. I am dismayed by the engagement process for this project: it has been clear in our engagement that the goal of the 'community input' meetings have been to coerce our neighborhood to say "Yes" to a project that the residents still have concerns about rather than a collaborative process to ensure that this is the best project possible. The community members on the Steering Committee have lost faith in City Staff and are frustrated due to the constant dismissal of their legitimate concerns since the initial Neighborhood Meeting. As a result of the dismissal of our concerns, the Steering Committee has shown its dedication to ensuring neighborhood concerns are taken seriously and created a survey with over 100 signatures from a unique coalition of neighbors, landlords, business owners, and property owners from our neighborhood concerned with this project. The petition calls for a better plan for the Lake Street Redevelopment and a more critical look into the proposed traffic plan. This petition demonstrates the community power and legitimacy of our neighborhood. The concerns of the local community must be taken seriously by city leaders who swear that community input matters.

We urge Eppstein Uhen Architects, LLC to follow the lead of the Mortenson Group who reached out to various local entities to engage in conversations about their development promptly after the neighborhood meeting. They not only listened to neighborhood concerns but incorporated these suggestions into their project for a more cohesive development. We urge city leaders to work with Eppstein Uhen Architects, LLC, to ensure that they participate in the design process with respect towards community engagement.

We recognize that the actual designs of Hawthorne Ct, accommodations for businesses in the form of loading/delivery spaces on University and perhaps Lake St, and the bus/car/loading/delivery parking along Lake are not yet determined. We anticipate that the design work of the architects could potentially shed light on how problematic some of the current circulation plans could be. We recommend that Alders and Staff send the plans to the Transportation Commission and the Board of Public Works to critically look at Lake Street Parking and Bus queuing. CANA must be updated throughout this process in order to provide

the most accurate recommendations for UDC and the PC as the city continues to work on this project, and in order to keep our constituents engaged and involved in the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment.

The City of Madison is neglecting the safety of pedestrians and bicyclists in the Campus Area Neighborhood.


The current traffic plan of the Lake Street Garage Redevelopment puts the intercity bus entrance to the building on Hawthorne Ct. This increases the risk of pedestrian and bicycle accidents/fatalities occurring on University Ave. By putting the intercity bus entrance on Hawthorne Ct, the plan forces intercity buses (Badger Buses, Van Galder, etc.) to cross an unprotected bike lane, an uncontrolled major pedestrian throughway, and a major BRT line into the uncontrolled Hawthorne entry.

The neighborhood has been raising concerns about this since August and we have seen no adequate response from the City. Frankly, not listening to the neighborhood and introducing this dangerous configuration into our neighborhood is completely neglecting the core principles of Vision Zero which honors the community as experts and looks for people-centered traffic plans as compared to vehicle-centered plans.

Sign this petition to hold the City of Madison accountable to the principles of Vision Zero and demand Common Council ask for a new plan.

Stand in solidarity with the Campus Area Neighborhood. Oppose the current traffic plan in the proposed Lake Street Redevelopment and demand an alternative that puts people first!


