

Planning and Development Update

Presentation to the Board of Park Commissioners February 8, 2023



Phase 2 of fencing repairs has been completed at Bowman Park. This project, costing approximately \$125,000, and was awarded to Patriot Fence. The work included rehanging access gates, replacement of the foul line fencing on the softball fields 1, 2, & 3, complete replacement of the bullpens on the baseball field, and installation of a weed/grass barrier product under the sections of new fence. This product was first tested in 2022 and received good reviews from staff. It prevents weeds and turf from growing up into the fencing, minimizing the need for string trimming and potential damage to the fence.



The bullpens on the baseball field were completely rebuilt and now more closely match industry standards. Parks also purchased new, portable bullpen mounds and padding for the receiving end to help protect the fencing.



This project is going to Common Council on February 7th for approval of plans/specifications and is anticipated to be bid beginning February 9th (second ad will be February 16th). Bids will be opened on February 23rd. Provided we have a successful bid opening, construction on the contract will begin in early May 2023 and completed by the end of July 2023. The neighborhood had a robust turn-out at our meetings with many kids on the Zoom call – who were instrumental in the selection of the colors: a combo of purple, red and aqua that they called the "spicy mix" due to the manufacturer's use of the word, "paprika" for the red color. Estimated contract for installation cost is \$312,000, project estimate (including cost of equipment purchased by Parks) is \$475,000.00.

This graphic depicts the layout for the new court complex at Penn Park. Adam has worked closely with the community surrounding Penn Park as he has developed this plan to reconstruct the existing two basketball courts and replace an existing tennis court with the mini-pitch.



The mini pitch is a small soccer field, suitable for either soccer or futsal. We propose to use this Musco product, shown above, to create a fun and active place for local youth and families to come together in the spirit of teamwork, empowerment, and fitness. The minipitch system comes complete with fencing, goals, benches, and lockable storage. Futsal is a sport similar to soccer, but the ball is smaller and heavier, it is played on a small court and favors ball handling skills over running ability. Futsal is faster and more intense, with continuous shots that demand players' higher mental and physical energy.
