The City of Madison applied for and has been awarded a grant through the WI-Public Service Commission - Office of Energy Innovation for the project "Energy Efficiency in Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (EE-NOAH)" This grant application was in partnership with Sustain Dane along with Elevate and the Northside Planning Council. Sustain Dane and Elevate have been working in the EE-NOAH sector since 2020 and were integral in securing the grant award. Sustain Dane was identified as the principal for the City to enter into a contract for the work on this project. A non-competitive sole source contract was awarded to Sustain Dane on July 20, 2021 by Madison Common Council (RES-21-00519) to administer EE-NOAH. Additional federal funds have been identified to continue the EE-NOAH program throughout 2023. Community Development Division is requesting to piggy-back off previous approvals to award up to \$220,500 in federal Community Development Block Grant funds and up to \$250,000 of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) to Sustain Dane.

Project Overview: Sustain Dane and Elevate will complete energy efficiency assessments and installations in the City of Madison's Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing stock. Sustain Dane & Elevate have been offering services for energy upgrades since 2020 and have been under contract for NOAH program with City of Madison since 2021.

COMMENTS REGARDING PURCHASES OVER \$50,000

The City of Madison has paid Sustain Dane a total of \$684,088 since 2015. Of that, \$27,301 was made up of small purchases each under the threshold requiring competitive selection. The remaining amount of \$656,787 was all non-competitive, with \$290,287 being compensation for the above-mentioned NOAH Project that this resolution is looking to add to.
