


- Detroit, MI

Timeline

- Early spring 2023 MAC recommendation to Council and contracting

- •Fall 2023: Return to MATC for another workshop
- •Fall/Winter 2023 –2024: Full-scale model produced
- Winter 2024-MAC recommendation to Council for model
- Spring/Summer2024: Casting & transport
- Summer/Fall 2024: Installing & Dedication


