



The proposed area **stormwater treatment** has **educational/visual importance** near John Nolen Drive

Floating elements near JND a challenge due to ice and wave movements.

Overpass might not be useful as bikers will want to stay on grade.

Please have separate lanes for bikes/pedestrian/runners (if space allowed, e-scooters)

If we potentially can have a place to **dock** near downtown, that will be great!

Olin Park and North Shore is perhaps more effective in **treating run-offs** than along John Nolen Drive, where it is very tight in space






