I am writing to the Common Council, as a constituent of Alder Cole in support of the Gaza Ceasefire resolution that the Common Council will vote on this Tuesday, December 5.

The Israeli government's response to Hamas's October 7 attack, in which Hamas killed 1,200 people and kidnapped more than 200 people, has been to kill more than 15,000 Palestinians in Gaza. Over 10,000 of those killed in Gaza were women and children. Sadly, this number is certain to go up regardless of a ceasefire because it does not include bodies not yet found under the rubble. Without a ceasefire, with 2.3 million Palestinians crowded into southern Gaza and with nowhere else to go, the number of civilian deaths is certain to become much higher.

Your local Palestinian, Arab, Muslim, and many others in your communities have been devastated by the number of bombs dropped on and the number of people killed in Gaza. Dear City Council Members,

As a concerned citizen and business owner in Madison, I am writing on behalf of my business and my family, to urge you to consider and accept the resolution demanding an immediate ceasefire to Israel's bombardment of the Palestinian people in Gaza, which has now extended to the West Bank despite Hamas not being in the West Bank. The repercussions of this latest senseless bombardment since Oct. 7, in terms of human suffering, economic burden on us as US citizens, many who are falling deeper and deeper into poverty, and societal impact, are deeply troubling.

The human cost of Israel's retaliatory bombardment is catastrophic, completely disproportionate to the initial attack from Hamas, and our country's complicity as a major financier of Israel's military as we watch them carry out a genocide of an indigenous people, sets an extremely dangerous precedent that diminishes our rights here in the US. What we condone for people abroad is a direct reflection of what will be condoned for people here. While Hamas provides the pretext for this latest attack on all of occupied Palestine, the real attack is on the people of both Israel, occupied Palestine and the world community of objectors to Israel's abuse of Palestinian people and their land. So many Israeli's who stand in solidarity with the plight of occupied Palestine are themselves scared of their own government, as are US objectors who are being fired from jobs and "blacklisted" for speaking up against Israel's actions.

Our aiding and abetting of this "war" that's killing mostly women and children and in breach of international law and very basic rules of war, lowers the bar for democracy the world over since the US is seen as setting the standard as the world's model for democracy. We can no longer point the finger at oppressive regimes after this.

The scale of violence on Gaza has reached an unparalleled level, marked by a deeply concerning number of killings of not only women and children, but journalists, doctors, and United Nations staff. This tragic loss of lives, especially in the manner it is being done, not only represents a humanitarian crisis of a nature I've not seen in my lifetime of 52 years, but also poses a long-term threat to humanitarian efforts worldwide. The profound impact of these events is likely to deter future generations from engaging in crucial humanitarian work, which is essential for preserving the prospects for humanity long term if we have any hope for ever achieving world peace - something I still believe is possible but only if we demand it every opportunity we get: like now.

Israeli officials have made clear their plan to expand and intensify their bombardment of Gaza. Israel loosened its constraints on attacks to allow for the bombing of civilians, targeting apartments, universities, banks, hospitals, in order to exert pressure on civilians, who clearly have no control over Hamas. This is only made possible by US funding. Every year we send \$3.5 billion dollars to Israel, an amount that Biden had increased to \$14 billion to assist in this attack on an area about as big as Philadelphia that is (or was) extremely densely populated by mostly children.

With our funding, Israel has been able to utilize artificial intelligence to mark targets since 2019 to accelerate target creation in Gaza. The idea is to create as much mass destruction as possible to ensure a shock effect on the Palestinian people under the assumption that they are all terrorists - including newborn babies - and can be traumatized into pressuring Hamas. With our funding, AI is creating targets faster than Israel can bomb. According to an Israeli reporter who spoke to Israeli military officials, 12,000 targets have already been generated by AI in this war. This leads me to believe that the loss of life far exceeds what's been officially reported.

What's been documented is that over 6000 children have been killed. Children who are still alive are writing their names on their little bodies in preparation for death so they can be identified if and when their bodies are found. On Dec 2, just after the ceasefire ended, Israel continued bombing apartment buildings. Infrastructure bombings are described as "power targets" which are primarily residential high rises where there are concentrations of civilians. The claim that there is even 1 actual military target legitimizes bombing an entire building full of people. These are indisputable facts and people all over the globe can simply tune in to see this genocide in real time, being bravely reported by a handful of vibrant young Palestinian journalists who are on the ground live-streaming the bombardment on various social media platforms as it happens so the world can see what we are doing to them...as they await their own deaths. Even Israeli defense force members have been speaking to reporters under anonymity describing Israel's actions as a terror tactic against the Palestinian people under the assumption that this will force them into putting pressure on Hamas. A sick and perverse strategy and one that clearly hasn't worked.

The attack on Gaza is now being described by some as the first "AI generated genocide in history" or as one Israeli combatant calls it: "a mass assassination factory" to describe how they're using artificial intelligence to select targets. As of Dec 1, the day the ceasefire ended, there were more than 15,000 casualties - including 6100 children and many many more injured who can't be treated because every hospital has been bombed - not just Al Shifa where we're still awaiting credible evidence that it was used as a command post for Hamas.

Another hospital, Al-Nasr, was seized by Israel and doctors were forced to leave or stay and be killed. When journalists recently went in weeks later they found the horrific sight of infants who were found dead and in a state of decomposition after being left alone for three weeks. This is in stark contradiction to Israel's propaganda which include pics of IDF soldiers bringing incubators to Gaza. They clearly have no regard for human life.

Contrary to International law and the "rules of war," Israel has been primarily targeting civilians, under the guise that Hamas is using the civilians as human shields. In one case, Israeli officials approved an attack they knew would kill up to hundreds of civilians in a bid to assassinate a single Hamas military commander. More than 120 civilians were killed in the October 31 bombing of the densely populated Jabalia refugee camp with at least two 2,000-pound bombs.

Economically, as a black business owner, I am particularly concerned about the financial strain this conflict places on our economy and how it's diverting funds from our communities. How can we afford this "war?" Why are we even funding Israel when our own people can't meet their basic subsistence needs at home?

The millions of dollars being spent on this war are funds that could significantly benefit vital city services and infrastructure. As a taxpayer, I am disheartened to see my hard-earned money diverted to support a cause that brings about destruction rather than growth and prosperity.

The nature of the weapons used in this conflict, especially the deployment of highly destructive bombs, raises severe humanitarian, ethical and also fiscal concerns about the legitimacy of what is going on. Aside from the fact that these weapons, including the use of white phosphorus and bombs that literally eject blades, cause

widespread damage and are extremely costly. We are now learning that Israel's reign of terror on Palestinians serves another purpose: to test the latest greatest tools of mass destruction, using Palestinians as guinea pigs. I'm beginning to believe this has nothing to do with Hamas, and given that Israel has now been found to be responsible for many of the Oct 7 deaths of its own citizens, I don't believe that their siege of Gaza has anything to do with keeping Israeli people safe.

Moreover, this war is creating divisive rifts in our own community. Instead of fostering unity and cooperation, it breeds hostility and division, which is detrimental to the social fabric of our city and what we claim to stand against.

I urge you, as our elected representatives, to voice the collective desire of our community for peace. By adopting a resolution for a ceasefire, our city can lead by example, championing the cause of peace and demonstrating our commitment to the welfare of our citizens over the destructive costs of war.

Thank you for your attention to this critical matter. I trust in your commitment to act in the best interests of our community and to take a stand for peace and unity.
