



2023 Traffic Enforcement Goals

- 5. Respond to Community Member Complaints




Traffic Grant Corridors / High Injury Network



Traffic Grants

- The Madison Police Department, in partnership with the Dane County Sheriff's Office, conduct extra patrols that, depending on the time of year, and focus on enforcing Wisconsin's alcohol, seatbelt, and speed laws.
- These additional enforcement efforts are made possible through traffic overtime grants provided by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.
- The goal of these extra patrols is not only to enhance public safety, but to prevent needless tragedies.
- Traffic grant activity is not confined to just the High Injury Network.
 Because MPD collaborates with the DCSO on alcohol, seatbelt and speed
 grants, grant activity must be held on city streets that are also county
 highways (shared roadways).



Traffic Grants

- All alcohol grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday
- 50% of seatbelt grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m.
- In addition to the grants, the Madison Police Department participates in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" and "Click It or Ticket" campaigns.
- The City of Madison also manages our own Pedestrian/Bike grants that are funded by the State of Wisconsin DOT.

- In the 4th quarter of 2023, there were 2 traffic-related fatalities.



 Summary: The victim, who had been traveling east on Packers Avenue prior to the crash, attempted to make a left turn from Packers Avenue onto Manley Street. The victim's vehicle was struck by a vehicle traveling west on Packers Avenue.

- On January 8th, officers arrested a 23-year-old male in connection with the fatal crash that occurred on Packers Avenue/Manley Street on November 10th, 2023.
- Evidence gathered indicates that two cars were racing at high speeds when suspect's vehicle collided with the victim's vehicle, resulting in victim's death.
- The 2nd suspect was booked into the Dane County Jail on a charge of Second Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety (a felony). The other suspect remains hospitalized.



- Detective Nelson helped review all of the area camera footage, in the hopes of locating and identifying the suspect vehicle.
- In the course of his extensive review of City camera footage, Detective Nelson located the likely suspect vehicle on the Packers Ave./Commercial Ave., camera, noting that said vehicle was travelling northbound on Packers Ave., near Commercial Ave.
- Detective Nelson was able to successfully trace this vehicle's movements in reverse order, locating the same vehicle on several cameras heading towards the downtown area, until he located the vehicle near the intersection of University Ave., and Frances St.



- After reviewing video, Detective Nelson suggested the possibility that a passenger being picked up by the suspect vehicle, which might have been a ride-share vehicle (Uber or Lyft), that was taking her to the airport.
- Detective Nelson reported that he was aware that the Fluno Center had rooms for guests to stay, and that the passenger might have stayed there.
- Detective Nelson suggested that the Traffic Investigator do follow-up at the Fluno Center and the airport to confirm.



- As a result, the Traffic Investigator visited the Fluno Center and requested a list of all the guests who had checked out from the 4th floor that morning, around 4:00 am.
- The Fluno Center provided the Traffic Investigator with a list of several names and phone numbers, (approximately 10 to 12 names).



- A Dane County Sheriff Department Deputy assigned to the airport used security footage to track the path of the female passenger who had been dropped off at the airport by the suspect driver. With the assistance of airport resources, the Deputy managed to identify her.
- The deputies provided a phone number for the female, and when the Traffic Investigator looked over the lists of guests who had checked out from the Fluno Center that morning, he noted that the female's name was on that list.
- When contacted, the female provided a statement.




Fatal Crashes 2007 – 2023






Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes





Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes






School Zone Safety

- The City of Madison Police Department's Traffic Enforcement and Safety Team (TEST) will continue to make school safety a priority in 2023.
- Every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, TEST officers begin their day at specific schools listed on the school rotation calendar.
- On Mondays and Fridays TEST officers focus on issues in their respective districts. However, TEST officers also respond to schools and school zone complaints in their respective districts as a part of their morning routine.
- In addition to providing a high-visibility presence to deter unsafe driving and enforcing school zone violations they observe, TEST officers work with the schools, bus drivers, and crossing guards to address specific, chronic issues.
- TEST members work closely with Traffic Engineering if and when signage is needed to improve school zone safety.
