URBAN DESIGN COMMISSION APPROVAL PROCESS



Introduction

The City of Madison's Urban Design Commission (UDC) has been created to:

- Encourage and promote high quality in the design of new buildings, developments, remodeling, and additions so as to maintain and improve the established standards of property values within the City.
- Foster civic pride in the beauty and nobler assets of the City, and in all other ways possible assure a functionally efficient and visually attractive City in the future.

Types of Approvals

There are three types of requests considered by the UDC:

- <u>Informational Presentation</u>. A request for an Informational Presentation to the UDC may be requested prior to seeking any
 approvals to obtain early feedback and direction before undertaking detailed design efforts. Applicants should provide
 details on the context of the site, design concept, site and building plans, and other relevant information to help the UDC
 understand the proposal and provide feedback. (Does not apply to CDR's or Signage Modification requests)
- <u>Initial Approval</u>. Applicants may, at their discretion, request Initial Approval of a proposal by presenting preliminary design information. As part of their review, the Commission will provide feedback on the design information that should be addressed at Final Approval stage.
- <u>Final Approval</u>. Applicants may request Final Approval of a proposal by presenting all final project details. Recommendations or concerns expressed by the UDC in the Initial Approval must be addressed at this time.

Presentations to the Commission

The Urban Design Commission meets virtually via Zoom, typically on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 4:30 p.m. Applicant presentations are strongly encouraged, although not required. Prior to the meeting, each individual speaker is required to complete an online registration form to speak at the meeting. A link to complete the online registration will be provided by staff prior to the meeting. Please note that individual presentations will be limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. The pooling of time may be utilized to provide one speaker more time to present, however the additional time will be based on the number of registrants from the applicant team, i.e. two (2) applicant registrants = six (6) minutes for one (1) speaker.

Primarily, the UDC is interested in the appearance and design quality of projects. Emphasis should be given to the site plan, landscape plan, lighting plan, building elevations, exterior building materials, color scheme, and graphics. Please note that presentation slides, in a PDF file format, are required to be submitted **the Friday before** the UDC meeting.

Existing use of this site: Office space for lease - retail businesses

Existing signage: All the existing signage meets the current sign code standard.

Request for approval Executive Investors LLC is proposing:

- The applicant is asking for consideration for one (1) new tenant ground sign. This sign would be for Executive Investor's retail office tenant business ID for two (2) tenants. These tenants are located in the building whose retail space faces the parking lot or the rear of the building. The offices that face the parking lot side and rear of the building are not eligible for wall space on the Odana Road side of the building for their signage. The applicant is requesting approval from the Urban Design Commission for two (2) grounds sign per lot. The ground sign is in accordance with the setback ordinance.
- 2(a) Each element of the proposed ground sign is found to be necessary due to the limitations with the building site location being on a corner lot. The necessity for adequate identification of the customer's tenants to be seen from the traffic on Odana Road. To provide adequate visibility for their customer's to easily identify their location.
- 2(b) The modification will result in a sign more in scale with the building, site and in a superior overall design for the tenants. The sign is aesthetically visual while being functionally efficient.

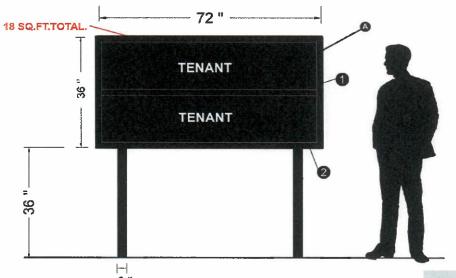
The companies that have leased from us over the 46 years have a retail orientation and view signage on Odana Road and Yellowstone Drive as extremely criticat to their businesses.

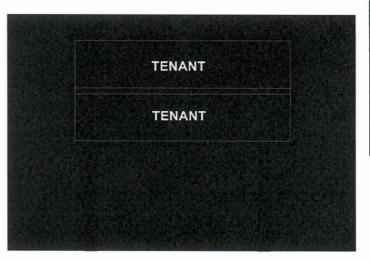
Over the years, tenants have included Econoprint, Miracle Ear, Concord Travel, Enterprise Rent a Car, Odana Chiropractic, Oral Surgery, Actra Rehabilitation, Dept. of Motor Vehicles Licensing Station, State Farm Insurance, Hertz Rent a Car and various financial companies including the current pylon sign user, Security Finance.

Importantly, the original pylon sign was installed by our anchor tenant, Wauwatosa Realty, and has always been used as single identification of our anchor user. It has never been a multi-tenant sign.
