Amending Chapter 34 of the Dane County Code of Ordinances, Prohibiting the Possession and Sale of Synthetic Cannabinoids

Policy Analysis Statement:

Brief Description of Proposal -

Amends Chapter 34 (Article 2, Section 34.09) to prohibit the possession and sale of synthetic cannabinoids in the unincorporated areas of Dane County.

Current Policy or Practice -

None

Impact of Adopting Proposal -

The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the health and safety of the citizens of Dane County by prohibiting the sale and possession of synthetic cannabinoids. Adopting this ordinance amendment will require Public Health--Madison and Dane County to follow up on any complaints on the possession and sale of synthetic cannabinoids in unincorporated Dane County. This is expected to cost the department less than \$500 per year to enforce.
