The University of Wisconsin-Madison, as one of the leading research universities in the nation, contributes significantly to the local, regional and state economies. Through the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation and our very successful University Research Park, our faculty has been able to commercialize many of the discoveries that have been made on campus. The MG&E Innovation Center within University Research Park is one example of a successful business incubator where university researchers have nurtured their ideas into a marketable product.

The city of Madison's proposed BioLink facility will help expand the region's business incubation capabilities. BioLink will serve four industry clusters to which the university has great interest: agriculture, biotechnology, food science, and sustainability. It will also provide a type of incubation space currently not found in Madison, with the ability to prototype plant-based technologies in a controlled-environment, greenhouse, and field test plots at a single site.
