History

The Berkley Oaks Neighborhood Association (BONA) has a history of advocating for an Independent Living facility to be built on the City's Northside at the site commonly called Tennyson Terrace. A few years ago, Independent Living had planned to build on Tennyson Terrace but the site was purchased by Tom Keller who then planned to build very large storage sheds on the property. BONA successfully advocated against Keller's plan and also against a plan to turn the site into a facility for storing repossessed vehicles. Tennyson Terrace is now for sale: http://propertydrive.com/search/property.asp?proptype=4&propid=1961.

Located at Tennyson lane and Packers ave/CV, Tennyson Terrace is a 19 acre parcel with conflicting residential land use recommendations and its current M-1 zoning. Because of this conflict and because it is believed Keller is desperate to sell the property there is concern Keller will sell to anyone and not care what the land would be used for. In its current zoning, the land could legally be used for pretty much anything. Since the parcel is in a residential neighborhood and next door to Lake View elementary School, there is great neighborhood concern with how Tennyson Terrace will be used. BONA continues to advocate for an Independent Living facility to be built on Tennyson Terrace or on the Raemisch property directly to the north of the school.

Adjacent to Lake View Elementary School to the north, the Raemisch family offers for sale a large parcel. The Raemisch property is attractively featured on pages 1 15-18 in the recently adopted Northport-Warner Park-Sherman Neighborhood Plan and has recommendations for mixed land use in a park-like setting.

Purposes

- •To share that there are neighborhood concerns regarding the current Independent Living proposal and there is a need for additional public comment before the CDBG Committee offers additional funding for the current Independent Living proposal.
- •The neighborhood asks if there is really a need for an Independent Living facility to be built.
- •The neighborhood asks the CDBG Committee to require Independent Living to seriously consider two properties adjacent to Lake View Elementary School for the project: the Keller property commonly called Tennyson Terrace and the Raemisch property bordering the school to the north.
- •The neighborhood asks Independent Living to use the same parameters in a site feasibility study for the Raemisch and Tennyson Terrace properties as they did for the Cherokee site.
- •The neighborhood asks the CDBG Committee to direct Independent Living to hold and attend a public meeting with the Berkley Oaks neighborhood.
