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Comprehensive Alcohol Risk Reduction (CARD) Project 2012

## **Problem Identification:**

- High degree of underage alcohol availability and consumption in the City of Madison.
- High number of High School and Post High School locations in the City of Madison.
  - 7 formal High Schools and many alternative learning programs.
  - UW Madison, Edgewood College, Madison College and many other satellite programs.
- High influence of Wisconsin customs related to underage drinking.
- High number of outlets in City of Madison making Madison a regional destination.

## Goals for Card grant project for City of Madison Police:

- Provide educational opportunities targeting the 16-20 year old age group, parents and licensed establishments.

- Public Safety Announcements related to targeted National Mobilization programs

- December 9<sup>th</sup> -13<sup>th</sup> 2011 (Booze and Belts Campaign)
- March 5<sup>th</sup> -21<sup>st</sup> 2012 (St. Patrick's Day Campaign)
- May 21<sup>st</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> 2012 (National Mobilization)
- July 2<sup>nd</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> 2012 (Summer Heat Campaign)
- August 16<sup>th</sup> September 3<sup>rd</sup> 2012 (Alcohol Crackdown)
- Outreach opportunities on Alcohol issues via:
  - MPD ERO Program in High Schools
  - MPD Safety Education Program
  - MPD Traffic Enforcement Safety Team Projects
  - MPD Neighborhood Officers
- To reduce sales of alcohol to minors by checking for compliance with Licensed Establishments in Madison
  - Utilize grant resources to complete comprehensive check of all retail outlets in Madison
  - Utilize grant resources to complete compliance checks at all restaurants in Madison >2 times.
  - Utilize grant resources to complete compliance checks at all bars/taverns in Madison >4 times.

- Utilize grant resources to target known time periods related to house party/drinking party behavior. This activity will rely on information provided by the public, schools, calls for service and observation by police officers. (Holiday breaks, proms, dances, graduations, sporting events)

- Partner agencies
  - -Dane County Sherriff Department
  - -UW Police Department
  - -DCCRA Dane County Coalition to reduce alcohol abuse.

-City Staff – Clerks office, City Attorney's office, Alcohol Policy Coordinator – Mayor's office.

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## Work Plan:

2) Adjustments will need to be made with the grant administrator as the approval process both with the State and the City has passed originally projected work dates.

3) Central District will coordinate the administration of the grant with a City wide focus.

4) Key goal for Compliance Investigation/Checks is to provide a consistent model for officers to use across the city.

- Compliance Investigation/Checks
  - a) Frequency of contacts (compliance vs. non-compliance)
  - b) Review of license conditions
  - c) Review of operating practices
  - d) Review of calls for service
  - e) Base line data for future
  - f) Opportunity for greater regular communication with establishments

5) Key goal for Party Patrol projects is to provide a consistent model for officers to use across the city and a consistent message to the community in regards to issues and enforcement outcomes.

-Party Patrol Projects

a) Public Service Messages on dangers and risks of underage drinking targeted for unsupervised drinking parties.

b) Educational opportunities and local schools and events to keep messages in public view with risks and consequences related to violations.

c) Consistent model of Party Patrol projects with focus on

- 1. Safety
- 2. Personnel Accountability
- 3. Reduction in repeat behavior/incidents.
