I have written before to express my support of the Block 100 Foundation Proposal but cannot attend the next commission meeting. In lieu of being unable to register my support on Monday night, I am writing to you again.

I am pleased that an agreement has been made about the redevelopment of State Street, but am greatly concerned that the Frautschi wishes to have a park will be dashed.

This is an incredible opportunity for the city to embrace. Cities have parks. They are breathing zones. The other contemporary buildings on that corner are and will be massive. This is a very contextual solution to that particular corner, which is a small corner by big city standards (the contrast could be Park Street and University Avenue = a much larger intersection).
