

Dear Members of the ALRC,

This letter is provide information about the negative impact that Plan B had, and continues to have, on my life at 913 Williamson Street.

I moved here in January of 2011. I was aware that I would be moving in across the street from a bar, tattoo shop, bakery, and hair salon.

I understood that Williamson Street was a very busy thoroughfare with lots of interesting businesses but really didn't expect to be kept up all night, 3 nights a week, by a night club. As neighbors, we pulled together to try and work with the owners of Plan B and city officials to try and solve these problems. A list of issues were improved upon but the problems with music/bass and guests on the street were not dealt with on a level to which the neighbors were satisfied.

For the year and a half that I have been at 913 Williamson Street, I have dreaded Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. I resigned to the idea that I would just stay up all night and put up with the noise because police said there was nothing I could do. Complaining to the non-emergency number did nothing, also. I felt trapped and helpless in my own home. The constant assault of the music from 11:30pm until 2am was maddening. I tried headphones, ear plugs, noise machines & nothing helped cover up the FEELING of bass thumping in my home and in my body. I finally started taking sleeping pills to get a good night's sleep.

I have always stated that I do not wish for Plan B's doors to close or for their business to suffer. There has to be a balance or compromise for everyone to have the best quality of life in & around Willy and Jenifer Streets. The power that Plan B and Chuck Chvala have as a huge money maker at 924 Williamson has threatened and taken advantage of the neighbors' good faith that these issues would be taken care of.
