Re: Legal Concerns in regard to Item #6 on agenda "water meter access" for Water Utility Board meeting 5-22-12

Dear Water Utility Board:

I have serious concerns as a citizen and as an attorney about Item 6 on the agenda for your meeting on May 22, 2012. This notice purports to give notice of a change to an existing city ordinance regarding "water meter access requirements." I submit to you that this item as now written fails to give reasonably adequate notice to the public about this matter under the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law, Sec. 19.81 et seq, Wis. Stats., as recently interpreted by our Wisconsin Supreme Court in *State ex rel. Buswell v. Tomah Area Sch. Dist.*, 2007 WI 71, 301 Wis. 2d 178, 732 N.W.2d 804. Whether notice is reasonable under the standard in *Buswell* requires a case-specific analysis" and "whether notice is sufficiently specific will depend upon what is reasonable under the circumstances." $Id., \P$ 22. In making that determination, the factors to be considered include: "[1] the burden of providing more detailed notice, [2] whether the subject is of particular public interest, and [3] whether it involves non-routine action that the public would be unlikely to anticipate." $Id., \P$ 28 (bracketed references added).

Although I have practiced law for over several decades, in reading this agenda item notice I find not even a hint that it refers to an extremely controversial subject, namely the Madison Water Utility's current implementation of so-called "smart meters" for water use throughout the City of Madison. I also find no hint that the proposed ordinance here offered for approval by this Board includes provisions for draconian <u>penalties up to \$1,000 per day</u> for any specified impairment to access by the property owner. The reason I am aware of this comes not from the published meeting notice but from an acquaintance who, knowing of my current interest in water issues, sent me information separately in an email about the content of this agenda item.

I am deeply concerned that a subject so controversial, involving virtually every citizen in Madison or its environs in the proximity of any water meter, has not received the benefit of reasonable notice to the public about this agenda item and the proposed ordinance changes which it references. It would have been so easy and simple for the meeting notice to include better and clearer clues to the content and import of this agenda item. Surely you are aware that the so-called "smart meters" which the Madison Water Utility is now seeking to install involve an unprecedented change in how water use is measured in our community—a change whose implications have not been sufficiently publicized.

Because this agenda item refers to subject matter which is far from routine, but is instead highly "novel" as this term is used by the *Buswell* court, I urge you now to table this agenda item until and unless the public can be given reasonable notice in compliance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law in regard to this proposed ordinance and related pending and proposed changes to the water utility system in Madison.

For your convenience I have attached the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law in its entirety, including Sec. 19.96, Stats., which provides:

No member of a governmental body is liable under this subchapter on account of his or her attendance at a meeting held in violation of this subchapter if he or she makes or votes in favor of a motion to prevent the violation from occurring....

I could be mistaken, but believe this legal provision would be complied with if this Board voted to table this agenda item as stated above until/unless the public can be given reasonable notice of its meaning and content.
