The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is conducting a corridor study to improve State Highway 51/Stoughton Road between US Highway 12/18 and State Highway 19. The study is investigating three alternatives, which involve reconfiguring State Highway 51/Stoughton Road at the following intersections: the West Beltline; Broadway; Pflaum Road; Buckeye Road; Cottage Grove Road; State Highway 30; Lexington Avenue/Commercial Avene and Railroad Crossing; East Washington Avenue; Anderson Street; Kinsman Boulevard; Rieder Road and Amelia Earhart Drive; Hoepker Road; County Highway V/Anderson Road; I 39/90/94; and Token Creek Park Road. Off-road bike and pedestrian paths are proposed for much of the length of the project. Right-of-way acquisition is proposed, and between 16 and 33 buildings are proposed for acquisition (and demolition). Please see attached map of project location. I have been hired to identify any buildings and structures that may be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places in the areas adjacent to the project (including those that may be demolished).
